



Charles Biggs died March 9th 2013. He is survived by his Wife Joyce, Son Kevin, Daughter in Law Lisa and Grandsons Jake and Jamie.

Born December 14th, 1932 in Deptford London, England, Charles first entered the toy and toy soldier business in 1947 and was initially employed by Zang of Herald fame during the period that Zang owned Modern Packaging. Charles continued to work for Zang and later Willmore, who produced Timpo up until he was eligible to be called up for National Service. Serving in the Royal Electrical Mechanical Engineers and stationed in Gibralter, Charles rejoined Zang in 1954 after being demobbed from the services. Upon the incorporation of Zang and his Herald range into the Britains company Charles remained at Britains as designer and sculptor and was instrumental in assisting with the design of the famous Swoppett line of plastics.

In 1992 Charles left Britains and became a freelance consultant and started his own toy soldier company with collector Arnold Rolak. They named the company Sceptre, but later it changed and became Premier and it was featured in Britains catalogs of the time until the contract was ended. Charles continued to produce and distribute his Premier range as an independent manufacturer thereafter. Well known and genial at all times within the toy soldier world Charles attended many toy soldier events on both sides of the Atlantic and will be sadly missed by his many toy soldier compatriots.

GREENWOOD AND BALL: AN EXAMPLE OF THE 25MM CONNOISSEUR RANGE – MAGNA CARTA

Greenwood and Ball's range of 54mm figures depicting types of the British Army as well as other types are highly sought after by a small number of collectors. Less well known is the fact that they produced an extensive range of figures in the much smaller 25mm scale.

John Greenwood of Wellington, Shropshire began making 40mm figures before the Second World War. In the 1940s he began working in 20-25mm scale (aimed in part at least at the war gaming market) before eventually moving to the 54mm scale figures which may be more familiar to most readers of this magazine.

His early figures were sand-cast, and therefore rather crude. They were individually animated by simply bending the limbs into position, with weapons being cast separately and soldered in place. This sometimes led to rather stilted poses. The bodies were not cast with great detail, many features being dependent on the painter's brush rather than the sculptor's tool (a trick that toy soldier manufacturers such as Britains were familiar with). Fortunately, much of the early output was painted by Katherine Ball (hence the company name of Greenwood and Ball).⁴ Her consummate skill brought relatively simple castings to life, with work that stands comparison with the best of her contemporaries such as Courtenay or some of the French masters. She was later joined by 4 other female painters who were not always able to match her high standards.

Although produced in war gaming size, the 20-25mm figures produced at that time (up to the mid 1960s) were generally regarded as collector's items rather than for the creation of mass armies. Along with Edward Suren (Willie figures), and Charles Stadden (of Tradition) Greenwood was famous for producing complex dioramas, depicting historical scenes.

By the 1970s Greenwood and Ball were morphing into a rather different company as first John Tassell developed the much chunkier range of Lasset models and Cliff Sanderson the Sanderson range of historical figures (covering less military subject matters, including slave markets, and tavern scenes). The Garrison range of wargaming figures continued the earlier tradition of small scale 25 figures, albeit rather more chunky and pre animated than Greenwood's earlier designs. The main emphasis by then was selling castings for collectors to paint themselves, rather than painted figures.⁵ John Greenwood sold his interest in the company in 1966 and died in 1971.

This article focuses on the earlier work of John Greenwood in the period up to 1966. The 20/25mm range covered a large variety of different types, but the main focus was on the British army. There was demand for some collectors for more esoteric types. John Garratt refers to one such commission in a set featured in the collection of Herbert Charles Faulkner.⁶ This set is featured here. Comprising 18 pieces it relates to one of the great turning points in British history.

Regarded by many authorities as the cornerstone of modern democracy, the "Magna Carta" was drafted in 1215 to resolve conflict between King John the 1st of England and some of his most powerful subjects. The Magna Carta can be seen as the starting point of a long historical process that led to the rule of constitutional law throughout the English speaking world, inspiring later constitutional documents, including the United States Constitution.

On 15 June 1215, under some duress, King John met with barons and others at Runnymede fields (somewhere between modern day Staines and Windsor), and put his seal to the document. It required him to proclaim certain liberties for his subjects and accept that his will was not arbitrary. As a consequence, no "freeman" (in the sense of nonserf) could be punished except through the law of the land, a right that still exists today.

The Greenwood and Ball set includes King John seated at a table with the scrolls in front of him, poised with quill pen in hand. In fact neither John nor anyone else actually signed the charter. It was sufficient for him to simply attach his seal to each of the copies made.

John is accompanied by men at arms and his standard bearer. The latter holds the Royal Standard of three gold lions passant on a red ground (the coat was created by his brother Richard 1st (Lionheart) who he had succeeded to the throne some 16 years earlier).

The scene was witnessed by at least 25 Barons present as surety for the enforcement of the agreement, numerous Bishops as witnesses (including the Archbishop of Canterbury) and various Abbots (also acting as witnesses and involved in drafting the document).

The Barons are represented by 6 knights, two with standards and an escort of three men at arms.

The Abbots are represented by monks in white, grey, black and brown robes. Franciscans' robes were gray or brown, Dominicans' were white with black cloaks, Benedictines' were usually black but sometimes white.

The standard of painting for the time was exceptional, the detail of the Archbishop of Canterbury provides a good example of Ms. Ball's work in this tiny scale.

Greenwood and Ball produced many other figures in this tiny scale, with a special focus on the Types of the British Army. These and their magnificent 54mm scale cousins will be the subject of a more detailed treatment in future articles, but the images shown here provide some indication of the quality of the work of this fine manufacturer.

Abbots included those from: Abbotebir; Abingdon; St Albans; St Augustine's in Canterbury; Bello; Chertsey; Cirencester; St Edmunds; Evesham; Hartstary; Hyde; Malmesbury; Middleton; Peterborough; Reading; Selby; Sherborne; Westminster; and Winchcomb. Others included: Llywelyn the Great and other Welsh Princes; Master Pandulff, subdeacon and member of the Papal Household; Brother Aymeric, Master of the Knights Templar in England; and Alexander II of Scotland.


MIDWEST BRITISH IMPORTERS OF MILWAUKEE

From time to time sets of lead figures appear with an intriguing box label entitled "Midwest British Importers." I recently acquired a 12-page Catalog and a 1952 Price Schedule from this wholesalers firm.

The Price Schedule highlights the cost per dozen, as well as the retail "List Price" for a single item. The standard wholesale trade discount of a 40% reduction from retail prices was applied. The 1952 Price Schedule gives an address of 444 North Plankington Avenue, Milwaukee 3, Wisconsin (from the days before Zip Codes). Their catalog contains only a small number of specifically identified Britains items-predominately artillery pieces 1201, 1263, 1264, 1266, 1292, 1725 and 2026; anti-aircraft instruments 1638, 1639, 1728 and 1729, but does note that "all other single sets are available at \$14.40 per dozen with a list on request" (referring to the single-row first quality sets that retailed at \$2.00 per box). The Price Schedule contains several horsedrawn items, including Set 39 Royal Horse Artillery, Set 234 "The Meet" Hunt Display, Set 2034 Prairie Schooner, and Set 2042 Prairie Schooner with cowboy escort and attacking Indians. The wholesale price for the magnificent Royal Horse Artillery gun team was \$5.70, and shops buying from Midwest British Importers typically sold Set 39 at a retail price of \$8.95. Three of Britains Second-Grade Fort Range sets: 212-S Cowboys and Indians (7 pieces), 232-S Scots Greys and Highlanders firing (13 pieces), and 237-S Foot Guards (7 pieces) were included. These Second-Grade sets were listed at the wholesale price of \$7.20 per dozen, half the price of the First-Grade line, or \$14.40 per dozen for the larger Set 232-S. A cryptic entry in the Price Schedule is "Collector Figures, \$3 to \$14.50 each (List on Request)". Which manufacturer's line this refers to can only be a matter of conjecture and speculation.

Their 12-page catalog also proposed that "this catalog is available with your imprint for \$50 per thousand. Minimum quantity, 500 at \$27.50." Several retailers, including the renowned Gimbels Department Store of Milwaukee, followed up on this offer and presented parts of the Midwest British Importers' catalog as their own for mail orders. The address given in the 12page catalog issued by Midwest British Importers is 618 West National Avenue, Milwaukee 4, Wisconsin. The catalog features classic advertising jargon: "A mere flip of the pages that follow will show the variety and scope of our new collection of miniatures, so enthusiastically welcomed by collectors of all ages. Each series offers a wide divergence of sets and individual pieces for countless play combinations.

Scenic backgrounds, fortresses and drawbridges enhance their play value. And, since each individual piece is so true to life, so true to fact in every detail, they have great educational value."

The front page of the catalog consists of Britains Set 1330, Royal Engineers Limbered Wagon retailing for \$3.75; Artillery pieces 1201, 1725, and 2026; and four Gama wind-up tanks "imported from the U.S. Zone of Germany" and ranging in price from \$1.25 (for a midget tank) to \$6.50 (for an colossal tank 71/2 inches long, 41/2 inches wide, and 4 inches high). Page 2 contains ten Johillco sets of the Union and Confederate armies at a retail price of \$1.95 for 6-piece or 7-piece single row sets and \$3 for 12-piece display sets. The third catalog page presents eleven "Historical Coaches" from the firms of F.G. Taylor or A. Barrett ranging from a Governess Cart for 75 cents to a charming Brewer's Dray with six beer barrels and a Watney's Ale sign for \$3. On page 4 are found more Taylor and Barrett items, including a Dutchstyle windmill, a Blacksmith with anvil and forge shoeing a horse, and Zoo animal rides, as well as the TIMPO Big Game Tiger Hunt with two elephants with howdahs for \$7.95, and TIMPO farm and zoo sets plus a six-piece set of "My Pet" dogs. Page 5 contains Johillco "Infantry in Action" for fighting World War II, with ten single-row sets retailing for \$1.50, plus a beachhead made of masonite with gun emplacements and trenches measuring 18 inches by 10 inches by 6¹/₂ inches which included 12 Johillco khaki soldiers selling for \$5. Fifteen different singlerow boxes of Johillco infantry encompassing Royal Navy sailors, Welsh Fusiliers, Highlanders, Evzones, U.S. Military Police with truncheons, West Point Cadets and U.S. Marines-all retailing for \$1.50

could be found on Page 6. A wide range of TIMPO Wild West sets of Cowboys and Indians containing 7 pieces for \$1.50 or \$1.75, single "Picture Packs" of Cowboys and Indians on foot for 50 cents each, and an 18-inch long wooden replica of storefronts along the "Main Street of the town of Golden Gulch" constitute the offerings on Pages 7 and 8. The 9th and 10th pages of the catalog feature larger Johillco a 20-piece British Guards band, a 9-piece sets: Crusaders set, a 13-piece unit of Guards in Winter Dress (comparable to Britains Set #429), a 6-piece set of Arabs on camels with their rifles raised above their heads, a 7-piece Beefeaters set along with 6 ravens, a Roman arena display set consisting of 6 Romans with shields and raised swords, two chariots confronting two lions, a leopard, a tiger and a black panther. The Roman set retailed for \$10, although a wooden tower and drawbridge guarded by 8 crusaders only cost \$5. Page 11, the penultimate page, includes a Johillco railroad station set of 11 pieces for \$2.50 as well two fairly simple Triang castles for \$5 and \$10, respectively. The final page of the catalog shows five artillery pieces made by Astra: the Fort Gun for \$2, a six-barrel rocket launcher for \$6.95, a twin-barrel pompom gun for \$7.95, a small Anti-Aircraft Gun for \$5, and a larger 3.7 inch Anti-Aircraft Gun with a 9-inch long barrel for \$10.95. These retail prices were all subject to a 40% discount for the shops and stores buying from the Midwest British Importers catalog. The catalog I purchased had an address label for Colonial Hobbies in Asbury Park, New Jersey.

An article dated September 18, 1949 from a Milwaukee newspaper reveals the man who started and ran Midwest British Importers. He was M.D. Orum, born in Manchester, England. His family migrated to the United States in 1927. Before founding his firm, Orum was a merchandise manager for a major department store in Milwaukee (not identified in the article, but the major department stores there were The Boston Store, Chapmans, Gimbels, and Schusters). The 1949 article emphasizes that Orum's company had an

arrangement with Hambro Trading Company of America that facilitated the payment of U.S. dollars to British firms and a war-ravaged economy that badly needed American funds to help its balanceof-payments deficit and to repay American loans during the War years. The Hambro Company was established by Hambros Bank in England to pay British manufacturers in British Pounds, but then take payment from U.S. buyers in American dollars instead of using the prevalent letter-of-credit system. Periodically, dollars would be remitted to England through the Hambros Bank in London. The 1949 newspaper article mentions that Orum "has placed substantial orders for hand painted lead cowboys and Indians and farm animals," and the photograph accompanying the article shows him holding two Britains figures: a Greek Evzone from Set 196 and a mounted Indian from Set 152. It is hard to say when Midwest British Importers wound down its business, but I knew Don Darneider, a long-time Milwaukee collector, back in the 1970s, and he told me that he bought many of his Britains, Johillco, and TIMPO sets directly from Midwest British Importers during the 1960s—perhaps after Orum's retirement. Judging from the number of Midwest British Importers boxes that show up, Orum ran a pretty successful business during the 1950s.







COLLECTIBLE SYROCO FIGURINES

During the years when we were building our Dimestore soldier collection, we traveled to many toy soldier, toy and antique shows, antique malls and auctions and would occasionally see some wood-like figures that dealers said were "syroco". They intrigued me but there was virtually no information available on them and certainly no "O'Brien book" on syrocos. By talking with dealers and meeting syroco collectors, I gradually developed contacts, pieced together what information I could find and began collecting these interesting figures. I sold our Dimestore collection several years ago but I still have my syroco collection that numbers over 200 figures. In a recent conversation with Norman Joplin, I mentioned that I would be selling my syroco collection and after I told him more about it, he suggested that I share the information about this niche of collecting with the OTS readers while I could still photograph the figures, so here it is.

The word "syroco" is a trade name acronym of the **Sy**racuse **O**rnamental **Co**mpany of Syracuse, New York, that operated from 1908 until 2005. The company was well known for casting a wide range of decorative furnishings and house wares using a formula of wood flour and polymers and their finished products closely resembled carved wood. The reason for this appearance is that the original mold masters were in fact hand carved by skilled artisans from wood blanks. Their product line was quite broad and ranged from wall plaques, small cigarette boxes, cork screws, paperweights, and pen holders to very large, ornate picture and mirror


frames to highly detailed room moldings and even casket decorations. Eventually, they coined the name "SyrocoWood" and began applying a foil label to their products embossed with this name and the name of their company.

Totally unrelated to the Syracuse Ornamental Company, a company was established in Chicago in the early 1940's by the name of Multi-Products Inc., not to be confused with the Molded Products composition, toy soldier maker. Multi-Products began making figurines of characters from the ever-popular Pinocchio story for Walt Disney. Multi-Products also had their original mold master figures hand carved from wood so the finished figures had the same carved wood look of syroco. To my knowledge, no one has ever chemically compared the casting compound used by the Syracuse Company and Muti-Products to determine if Multi-Products copied the Syracuse company's formula or developed one of their own. Although Multi-Products cast their name into each figure, people still called them "syroco" and the name stuck, similar to the generic names of xerox and kleenex.

All seven of the main Pinocchio characters; Pinocchio, Geppetto, Jiminy Cricket, Lampwick, Giddy, Honest John, and Figaro the cat, were made in three sizes; 2-inch (the most common), 5-inch and 7-inch. The character's name was cast into the front of the base and the back of the base was marked with a copyright "C" " WALT DISNEY PROD MULTI-PRODUCTS CHICAGO". While all figures were made in each size,

the poses were not necessarily the same for all three sizes. There are four different poses of Pinocchio and Geppetto probably because they were the two main characters in the story. mailing box. A rare, surviving original box is pictured. These figures were also sold in five and dime and variety stores.

A set of three 3-1/4" X 5-3/4" Pinocchio syroco wall plaques, table lamps, and other Pinocchio related accessories for children's rooms became popular at this time because that was when Disney's Pinocchio movie debuted. Prices today range from \$375 for the largest Pinocchio to \$300 each for the wall plaques and \$85 for a 2-inch Giddy, in near mint condition. As in all collectibles, condition is everything and syroco is brittle and will chip if abused.

In 1944, Multi-Products began making figures of contemporary comic strip characters under license with King Features Syndicated, Inc. (KFS). The five inch tall figures had the name of the character cast into the front of the base and the copyright "C" and "K.F.S. 1944" cast into the back of the base. Some of the figures were offered through magazine ads that advised that a figure could be purchased for 25 cents and the top from a Pillsbury Farina cereal box. The figures were shipped in a corrugated, cardboard sleeve that was inserted into a colorful, illustrated,

The syroco name carried over to their KFS figures and is still used to describe them today. Prices range from around \$1,500 for the PHANTOM to \$750 for FLASH GORDON to \$75 for the smaller figures of children like COOKIE, FRITZ and HANS. The adult female figures sell for \$375 or more because so many have been repaired at their ankles since they are so thin and easily broken at this point. Professionally repaired, rare figures are still very collectible but sell for much reduced prices. The astounding increase in value of these KFS figures, from their 25-cent original price, is far greater than the increase in value of most toy soldiers, primarily because so few KFS figures were made.

Another highly collectible set of syroco figurines is the GREAT AMERICAN SERIES. These six inch tall statues, with the exception of the soldier and sailor, have their name on the front of the base in capital letters and a copyright "C", a large "A" and "1941" on the back of the base. The complete set of eleven figures includes:

Abe LINCOLN General MACARTHUR Ben FRANKLIN Peter STUYVESANT BUFFALO BILL Teddy ROOSEVELT DIAMOND JIM Brady George WASHINGTON WILL ROGERS in a red and a brown jacket A caricature of a salty sailor (No name on front) A caricature of a tough 1st sergeant (No name on front)

I'm not sure how Peter Stuyvesant, the governor of New Netherlands (New York) in 1612, qualified for membership in this famous group but he did have a cool wooden leg. Also the New York millionaire of the 1900's, Diamond Jim Brady, seems out of place in this gallery. However, I was happy to see that the maker regarded soldiers and sailors as GREAT AMERICANS. Prices for all GREAT AMERICAN figures are generally the same and range from \$150 to \$175 depending on condition. The maker has never been positively identified but most syroco collectors believe that Multi-Products made them.

Figural syroco thermometers, with a chemically treated section that changed color with the weather and served as a poor mans barometer, were quite popular in the 1940's and 50's. I have never seen one marked with a manufacturers name but most syroco collectors assume that Multi-Products made most if not all of them.

Multi-Products made other interesting syroco statues that served as recognition or appreciation pieces for those employers who solicited their employees on behalf of the old Community Chest charity that later became the United Fund and United Appeal. Most of these seven-inch tall figures contain the year of manufacture and MULTI PROD INC. on the back of the base, and most also had a foil label on the front of the base embossed with "COMMUNITY CHEST" or "UNITED FUND", the year, and "CAMPAIGN AWARD". The glue that held these labels in place dried over the years and caused many of the labels to be lost. Some figures had a tiny hole in their head into which a small red feather, the traditional symbol of the campaign, was inserted. Every contributor to the charity, even school children, was rewarded with a small red feather that they proudly displayed on their shirts, blouses and jackets. PETER PAN was selected as the figure of the year for several years; the old Kentucky Colonel for three years, CHARLIE BROWN for two years in two different poses, JIMINY CRICKET, WILL ROGERS and most others only held the spotlight for a single year. Prices range from \$35 for PETER PAN to \$95 for WILL ROGERS, CHARLIE BROWN and other single year figures. The figures in my collection span from 1946 to 1966 and a few of them are pictured along with an old, red feather.



Syroco COMMUNITY CHEST AWARDS

A large number of syroco figures were made by the Syracuse Ornamental Company and Multi-Products, depicting a wide range of subjects from Boy Scout memorabilia, animals, caricatures, advertising pieces and more but a great many are not marked in any way. Pictured are some of my favorite miscellaneous syroco pieces. None are marked except as indicated.

SENATOR SNORT cartoon character marked "C 1953 FIELD ENT." (the company that owned the rights to the cartoon character) 6-1/2"; advertising piece for Louisiana Coffee, marked "FAMOUS LOUISIANA MAMMY, 6-1/2"; soldier at attention, 6"; sailor at ease, 5-1/2"; "Pilot" in cold weather flight gear, marked in script on the front, 5-1/2"; ash tray with the nose and wings of P-51's, 5" long; a beautifully detailed cigarette box with various battle scenes on each side and a combat soldier on the lid 4" X 5" Marked "1941 MULTI PRODUCTS CHICAGO"; a 6-1/2" tall bartender with a bottle opener in the base and a "SyrocoWood" foil label: and a 9" tall old nag with a lantern around it's neck that I think is neat.

Prices vary widely on these miscellaneous pieces with advertising and military figures bringing around \$125 and the bartender, \$65. Small syroco animals and caricature figures sell for as little as \$5.

Well that's the story and I hope you found it interesting. While there may have been some smaller companies that made syroco-like items, the Syracuse Ornamental Company and Multi-Products made the vast majority of them. You may see the words sirocco or syrocco (with an extra "c") used in describing syroco items but these are simply innocent spelling errors and do not refer to a different compounding material or company. Perhaps as you travel around in your search for toy soldiers you may run across some of these most interesting figures from the 1940's and 50's. But be careful...you could get hooked on them and most of them take a lot more display space than a three-inch toy soldier.



TARZAN By Don Pielin



Timpo Tarzan, Hippopotamus and Original Box

Tarzan was born, so to speak, on the pages of the October 1912, issue of All Story magazine, one of the many pulp adventure publications available at the time. It was unusual in that the entire book was published in a single issue. It was entitled "Tarzan of the Apes" and created a sell out issue. The author was the then unknown writer, Edgar Rice Burroughs. Burroughs, himself, was born in Chicago in 1875, one of 5 sons of Civil War veteran, Major George Tyler Burroughs. Raised in the suburb of Oak Park, his schooling was somewhat scattered as his parents moved him around to avoid the various epidemics spreading through large cities near the end of the nineteenth century. He did eventually graduate from the Michigan Military Academy and applied for admission to West Point. When he failed the entrance exam, he enlisted in the army, requested a posting to the cavalry and found himself in the famed 7th Cavalry, of Custer fame. After a few years of chasing renegade Apaches around Arizona (and never catching any), Burroughs was discharged because of health issues. He returned home and went to work for his father in the battery business. married and had 2 children. Striking out on his own, Burroughs was a failure at almost everything he tried; his strong suit was his imagination, which wasn't a very saleable commodity in the business world. He now found himself broke with few resources to help him out of his situation.

Edgar Rice Burroughs tried his hand at writing for the pulp magazines because as he put it "if people were paid for writing rot such as I read in some of those magazines that I could write stories just as rotten. As a matter of fact, although I had never written a story, I knew absolutely that I could write stories just as entertaining and probably a whole lot more so than any I chanced to read in those magazines" With the success of his stories on the pulp press, his first stand alone book was published in 1914, <u>Tarzan of the Apes</u> is still in print. Hence an American icon was born, 26 of his Tarzan stories were published as books, over seventy movies were made from his stories, and countless collectibles have been produced based on the Tarzan character.

There were numerous paper and cardboard representations of Tarzan available from the onset of the book's publication. Possibly the first toy figure of Tarzan was a premium from the Foulds Pasta Company of Libertyville, Illinois, dating from sometime in the 1930's. The set included not only Tarzan, but also several other characters as well as animals in a hollow cast white ceramic material, meant to be painted by the child who sent away for the set.

Although the first Tarzan movie was made in 1918, staring Elmo Lincoln, it was the movies of the 1940's and 50's that spurred the production of toy figures. Johnny Weissmuller, the former Olympian, and Buster Crabbe in the lead role wowed the kids of the era. It is from this period that most of these toys came.

The Timpo, Reyco and EG/Toys sets will all be featured in the upcoming Old Toy Soldier Auction on Saturday, June 22, 2013.

Kriegsmarine Standing

I. Preface

As part of his production coverage of World War II military figures, Michel Klimov, owner of The Durso Company of Liege Belgium, did indeed produce composition figures of the German Navy (Kriegsmarine). More about this later in the article.

II. Background

In 1919, the signing of the Treaty of Versailles, which officially ended World War I, set limits on the size and scope of future German Military Forces.

The Reichswehr, as this small military force was known, was established for defensive purposes only, and its size and composition was to be strictly controlled by the Allies in order to prevent future German aggression.

The total number of men in the Reichswehr was limited to 100,000 and was divided between a small Army, the Reichscheer, and a defensive Navy, the Reichsmarine. This scenario remained in effect for fewer than 15 years, as the political climate in Germany was rapidly evolving.

III. Discussion

In 1933, under the leadership of Adolf Hitler, the National Socialist German Workers Party (NSDAP) emerged to take control of the country and the infamous Third Reich was formed.

Shortly thereafter, in 1935, came sweeping changes to the German Military that were initiated by the unilateral renouncing of the Treaty of Versailles by Germany.

The Armed Forces became known as the Wehrmacht, and rapidly expanded to include not only the Army, but also a Navy, now to be known as the Kriegsmarine, and a newly created Air Force, the Lutwaffe.

IV. Kriegsmarine 1935 - 1945 (World War II)

In May of 1935, under the Third Reich, the Kriegsmarine was established and grew rapidly, not only in the number of ships and men, but in the scope of its influence. In just a few years, its makeup consisted of three main components:

1. The Kriegsmarine boasted a fleet of "thousands of ships", including its highly effective and dreaded U-Boat contingent. 2. The Ground Forces of the Kriegsmarine provided a massive network of large Naval Guns, and other artillery units, that wielded much influence along the Atlantic and all across Western and Eastern Europe.

3. Naval Infantry Forces, Communications and Engineering Units completed the third component of the Kriegsmarine structure.

V. Conclusion

During the period of World War II, over 1 1/2 million military personnel served in the Kriegsmarine alone.

Although its Naval Force never equalled that of the Royal Navy of Great Britain, the effectiveness of the Kriegsmarine did present a large measure of concern to the Allies until 1944 when Allied Naval and Air Forces essentially destroyed the entire German High Seas Fleet and U-Boat Force.

Although small "shore boats" and other auxiliary vessels continued to function during the waning days of World War II, the threat and influence of the German Navy was over (kaput).

In August of 1946, the Kriegsmarine, after an existance of slightly over 11 years, was officially disbanded by the Allied Control Commission.

VI. Durso and The Kriegsmarine

Our Readers may recall that in previous issues of Old Toy Soldier Magazine we featured composition figures made by Durso of the Dutch Navy (vol. 35, no. 3) and the French Navy (vol. 36, no. 2)

Now with the German Navy, the coverage of Durso production of World War II Naval figures is complete.

At the request of a collector, a 16 figure Kriegsmarine series was produced in Michel Klimov's home in the mid to late 1970's (after the Durso factory had closed its doors in 1972). As long as he had the molds fabricated, Mr. Klimov decided to make a limited amount of these figures to sell to other collectors. In a departure from his design in the latter part of the factory production, Klimov decided to make the Kriegsmarine figures with a rectangular base (rather than oval) in order to be similar to the Lineol Kriegsmarines. Since the last "catalog" to be published by Durso was in 1961, this Kriegsmarine Series was never officially cataloged by the company and given an "ID Number". However, as an aid to all collectors, a "new number series" was created by knowledgeable collectors in Belgium utilizing the first digit "4", which Durso reserved for German figures.

Joan of Arc, French, Jeanne d'Arc, Born ca 1412 - 30 May 1431, nicknamed The Maid of Orléans, is a folk heroine of France and a Roman Catholic saint. She was born a peasant girl in what is now eastern France. Claiming divine guidance, she led the French army to several important victories during the Hundred Years' War, which paved the way for the coronation of Charles VII of France. She was captured by the Burgundians, transferred to the English in exchange for money, put on trial by the pro-English Bishop of Beauvais Pierre Cauchon for charges of "insubordination and heterodoxy", and was burned at the stake for heresy when she was 19 years old.
