

BRITAINS TAGGED FIGURES

For a short time, prior to 1930, it was a requirement of the US Customs that a metal tag signifying the country of origin, was placed on all unboxed figures exported to the US by Britains Ltd. There is no real or proven evidence as to why







this practice was required, as the 1920's were a time of financial uncertainty and economic depression, some tariffs were introduced to protect local industries. This could have been one. There is also a probability that a charge or tax was levied on all imported figures and this was a form of identification.

The requirement would not be necessary on any boxed sets as they were identified as "Made in England" on the actual box. It was eventually agreed the tag was superfluous as most individual civilian figures were cast with the declaration "Made in England". Indeed, with the garden seat (568) the tag is next to the legend. "Britains Ltd Made in England"



With only two exceptions, all figures, since seen, have been prewar, as no civilian figures issued after 1929 have been found to have

I have seen only two military figures with the tag and both were 2nd grade quality, these were not boxed and so needed identification, whereas all 1st

quality figures were tied into Britains boxes. One figure, a 3rd Hussar, is shown on the front cover, and the other, a mounted officer of the US Cavalry, is shown in the accompanying photographs.

To ascertain the dates that export tags were placed on Britains 2nd Grade Military figures it becomes necessary to trace the production of the items, eliminating the dates that tags were not used or required.



BRITAINS TAGGED FIGURES (Cont.)

The 2nd grade mounted Hussar figure illustrated on the cover was formerly part of the Arnold Rolak collection auctioned by Christies as lot #88 in December 2000. The figure was originally introduced into the Britains line in 1902, available as an un-numbered boxed set of four (GBB-Opie page 83 # 140). After the success achieved by Britains, in 1925, in supplying the South American market with toy soldiers, a concentrated effort was made towards the US market. Second grade items were produced in vast quantities for export to the US, and several new items, depicting the military, were produced.

The 3rd Hussar was listed in the 1925 New Lines list as available in a set of five with a catalogue number 6A. They were also sold as individual items in the Bulk Line as item number 40L. The 2nd grade numbering system was changed by Britains in1928 and the previously listed 40L

ure, when issued as a single figure between 1925 and 1929, displayed the export tag, as by 1929 the practice appeared to have been abandoned. No figures were issued after 1929 bearing the tags. In 1936. the 3rd Hussar(2nd grade) was again renumbered, this time as 61N.

Originally introduced in 1926 as a further expansion of the output destined for the US market was set 41A, entitled "USA infantry with mounted officer". The officer was also used, with a paint downgrade, as a US cavalry figure in a number of sets

including, 46A, 47A, 48A, 54A and 55A. In 1927 the figure appeared in sets 72A, 74A, 85A and 88A. It was not until 1928, during the renumbering of the 2nd grade range that this figure was issued





How many tags have been removed? Figures with tags are becoming increasingly difficult and expensive to come by. The tag was made to be easily removed by simply bending back and forth, any made with the tag and not intended for export, had the tag removed at source. Why do tags seem to be exclusive to Britains Ltd? Surely other figure makers sold their goods in the US, but why have none ever been found tagged? Different peo-





VECTIS TO OPEN IN AMERICA

The world's largest toy auction house gets a foothold in the USA.

Vectis, the largest toy auctioneer in the world, with a turnover of £5 million, is to open in America.

Bryan Goodall who has owned the Teesside based company for seven years, has just acquired "Diecast Toy Exchange Auctions", a well-respected auction house based in York, Pennsylvania with over 20 years of diecast experience including the last 5 years of catalogued diecast auctions on a regular basis. The current Diecast Toy Exchange auction team will remain intact and are ready to assist collectors needs at 717-846-8097.

It is part of Vectis's ongoing expansion plans, which in the past has seen the company take over all toy sales for Sotheby's in the UK and purchase Barry Potter Auctions.

Bryan Goodall said: "This latest acquisition will be called Vectis USA, and we will be looking at all aspects of toy collecting, including toy soldiers, tinplate and diecast, trains, dolls and teddy bears just as we do in the UK."

He added: "This is a natural expansion of our business. A large proportion of the collectors and dealers we cater to are based in North America and now we will be able to give them an even better service."

This year Vectis will hold five auctions in York, Pennsylvania, which is the home of toy collecting in the United States with many auction houses, dealers and collectors based in the area.

The company also runs the famous British Toy Soldier and Figure Show which is held at the Royal National Hotel in London three times a year.



Obituary, Bill Bertoia

If there was a toy collector's hall of fame, Bill Bertoia was the Babe. A larger than life figure whose passion for life was only overshadowed by his sheer grace on the field. He was a master at the art of the deal with an uncanny ability to bring out the child in us all. On May 6th, at the age of 52 we lost a great player, William S. Bertoia.

For soldier collectors, the Bertoia name is relatively new, but to the toy and collectible world he was the Commander and Chief. From his lakeside Vineland, New Jersey home, he ran his toy empire. Collections from all over the world were bought, sold and brokered. His life story could be the making of a Hollywood movie. Born in Quilmes, Argentina to Hector and Ophelia, Hector knew that life in the town known for beer was not the life he wanted his children to live. In search of something better, he gathered what little money he could and came to America to put his one expertise to best use. Hector is a master of geometry and he quickly was able to prove his worth in the glass factories of New Jersey.

A little over a year later, Hector had made enough money to move his family to America. Bill, his younger brother Rich and Ophelia arrived in Millville, New Jersey in the early 60's with very little money

and very little English. They were rich in the knowledge that they were now in a country where anything is possible. Bill and Rich quickly demonstrated their entrepreneurial skills by rummaging though old dumps in search of early bottles. Hector would then drive the trio every Sunday to The Black Angus and Shupp's Grovetwo of Pennsylvania's major antique markets--where they learned the ropes of the antique business. Bill graduated Millville High School in 1968 and realized that the business world was best suited for him. Antiques though, were not the venue he first chose. Blue jeans were the trend and Bill was best at reading and exploiting the trends. He opened a small retail shop with his then girlfriend and now wife Jeanne. The jean business was good but he never quit wheeling and dealing fruit jars and bottles. Then one day something profound happened--a friend of his brought in some old toys that he picked up at a market. Bill bought them with the notion of selling them and the antique toy world was never the same.

Although he did not know it at the time, Bill was going to take the objects of childhood's past and elevate them to art. He saw the beauty in the toys and was able to express that to others. The rest is history. From the mid eighties though today, Bill either brokered or auctioned though Bertoia Auctions the finest collections of the time-Atlanta Toy Museum, Perelman's Museum, Heagerty Collection, Norman Collection ,Sax Collection and, most recently, the Ilyinsky Collection of Britains figures.

Bill was an enthusiastic fly fisherman, skier and master diner. He is survived by his parents, wife of 25 years Jeanne, daughter Lauren, son Michael, brother Rich and sister-in-law Trina.

Obituary, Max R. Schulman

Max R. Schulman passed away on June 15, 2003. Born in 1935, Max grew up in Beverly Hills, Ca., and was a lifetime toy soldier collector. Truly a unique character to our hobby, he was the product of his colorful past, having been a Polynesian dancer, ambulance driver, engineer for the Fire Authority, and a civic leader in his community.


Max co-founded the West Coaster Toy Soldier Show and was creator and proprietor of his STE Ltd line of soldiers sculpted by Jack Duke of Ducal. Ohio Toy Soldier Show

Sunday, May 18th, marked the 11th annual Ohio Toy Soldier Show & Sale in the small town of Richfield, mid-way between Cleveland and Akron. The show has been held each year in the ball-room of the Richfield Holiday Inn on Brecksville Rd., quite conveniently located near the Ohio Turnpike (I-80), I-77 and I-271. Show organizer Doug McClure said that, once again, the show was completely sold out as more and more dealers seek to participate in what is becoming one of the better small-scale regional shows. With the increase in dealer participation, Doug has decided to move the show to a larger venue for next year's event. This year there were 32 dealers at 78 tables (a considerable increase over past year's shows) with some dealers setting up in the lobby area immediately outside the ballroom. As usual, variety was the hallmark of this show; an enormous range of both new and vintage merchandise was on display. A collector could find everything from early Britains and Heydes to contemporary plastics, and from high-grade dimestores to exquisitely crafted Russian miniatures; all were on offer at the well-laden tables.

Many respected Midwest dealers were in attendance, including K. Warren Mitchell & Rod Chapman from central Ohio, Toledo's Joe Saine, Gail & Tony Teper of Cleveland's "The Toy Box," Indiana's own Barry Carter and John Hazlett from nearby West Virginia. But a number of East Coast dealers made the long trip to Richfield as well. Greenwich, Connecticut dealer Robert Helm, dealer and show promoter Ed Gries from Hackensack, New Jersey, and even the folks from the Hobby Bunker in far-off Malden, Massachusetts journeyed to Ohio for the event.

Most dealers indicated that this year's sales were markedly better than those at past years' shows, no doubt due to the significant upturn in attendance. Promoter Doug McClure estimated that over 225 people went through this year's gate. All in attendance agreed that this year's event was an unqualified success. The many smiles on the faces of dealers and collectors alike attest to their satisfaction with the day's proceedings. Some will, no doubt, be sorry to leave the Richfield venue, but Doug has promised an even better facility for the future. Starting with next year's event, all future shows will be held at the Holiday Inn, Hudson, Ohio, (approximately 15 minutes drive from the old location) and will occur annually on the third Sunday in May. Once again, easy accessibility is guaranteed as the new venue is located at state route 8, exit #180 of the Ohio Turnpike (I-80). 



MY TANK A Reminiscence in Scale

By E. W. Fitzgerald

During 1966 I was the company commander of A Company 2nd Battalion 1st Training Brigade at Fort Knox, Kentucky. Our entire Battalion's mission was to provide advanced individual training in tank operations to young soldiers just out of basic combat training. In short, we taught them how to "move, shoot and communicate" using the best hands-on training techniques of those days of yester-year.

The Battalion was equipped predominately with M48 A3 "Patton" tanks. These were powered with a 750-hp diesel engine that could propel the 104,000 pound M48 A3 at up to 30



mph. Its armament featured a 90mm main gun together with .50 and .30 calibre machine guns. The crew of four consisted of tank commander, driver, gunner and loader.

The picture above of "My Tank" with me in the tank commander's position was taken in April 1966 at a retirement review for the Master Sergeant at the far right of the reviewing stand. Shortly after the picture was taken all of our M48 A3 tanks were withdrawn for shipment to Vietnam (their diesel fuel would not explode). But that is another story.

I left the Army later that year to become a C.P.A. and thought I would never again "command" an M48 A3 tank. Then last year, much to my delight, while shopping at my local Toys-R-Us, I came across and purchased a beautiful, big 1/18 scale plastic model M48 A3 tank which is perfect in every detail, including working tracks and traversing turret (Fig. 1). This beauty was manufactured in China and imported to the U.S.A. by American Century Toys of Alameda, California. It's great for an old tanker to have such a fine model to show his grandson what he did in the Army almost 40 years ago. I have also acquired a 1/50 scale M48 A3 Patton tank manufactured by Corgi (Fig. 2) as part of their Fire Base 'Nam Series.

This article is dedicated to Col. Robert M. Carroll, my Battalion C.O., friend and mentor who taught me much about the Army and life.

Surviving Christie's

A musty smell fills the air at Christie's Kensington on Old Brompton Road in London. I find a metal fold-down chair in the corner of the room-out of the way of the serious collectors-and hope that no one objects to my being here. My husband has a euphoric look on his face as he asks me, "Will you be okay?" Without waiting for an answer, (I swear to God) he scampers off. "I guess so," I answer to the empty air.

I had expected Christie's to be a little, if you'll excuse the expression, pompous. But I was wrong. A striking young woman with long black hair stands on the opposite side of the room. She is talking to two young men who look about twenty-five. She is wearing tall leather black boots and looks quite

chic, in spite of the green server's apron, a centuries old tradition for Christies's auction employees. realize that I stand out in my American blazer, worn-only-for-travel-jeans, and comfortable walking shoes. Self-consciously, I cross my legs and try to look like I belong.

(Dear reader) You're probably asking yourself right now, what's a nice girl like you doing at an offuddy duddy's toy auction? I asked myself that very same question in the cab ride over to Christie's I'll try to explain. Last night my husband and I were having dinner at Giovonni's Italian restaurant. Hasked, "Why don't you come with me tomorrow morning?" I cut into my medium-rare veal chop, savoring the olive oil, rosemary, and garlic taste in my mouth. "Why would I want to go?" I asked. Hsaid, "Because you can write about it. How many times do you get to write about a toy auction in London?" After three glasses of Pino Grigio, his argument sounded perfectly sound. "Okay, you've convinced me." You see, I'm a beginning writer. I have just finished my first Creative Writing class a Florida International University, a late-in-life endeavor. (I got a B+. Sorry, I just had to throw that in.) But I am also a toy soldier widow. I am here in London for the May 8th auction. My husband, a collector, is reluctant to admit this fact, but he owns one of the world's finest toy soldier collections, a finely picked conglomeration of precious figures made by Lucotte, Heyde, Mignot, and countless other manufacturers.

Originally I hadn't planned on coming to London. It was supposed to be 'boy's week out,' something Tom and I (stupidly on my part) agreed to early in our marriage. Ergo, for that one week, I arm

toy soldier widow; while my husband gallivants off to exciting, faroff places like Paris, Frankfurt, London, (and once Turkey) in search of the perfect find. When I realized that school wouldn't start again for another six weeks, I pleaded with him, "If you take me along I won't get in the way. You'll enjoy the company. Hey, give a girl a chance!" He bit... and here I am.

It is 9:00 A.M. on the first viewing day and the room is practically empty. Hundreds of boxes sit on table after table. Each box contains the lot number. Soldiers and toys fill two rooms. Selected lots have been placed in cases. These lots are the most valued of the toys. In order to view these lots collectors must request to inspect them under the scrutiny of the Christie's assistants.

A photographer enters the room and the woman with the long black hair speaks to him. She flashes a brilliant smile and flips her hair between manicured nails. Feeling like chopped liver, I glare at my Easyrider sneakers and wish that I had worn my more elegant Chanels.

Tom races around the room with a wild-eyed look of child-like-elation on his face, as he inspects cartons filled with toys. Absorbed in his search, he is unaware of anyone else in the room. I have seen that same look on many other collector's faces. It's almost as if they go into some sort of translike state. The eyes seem to glaze over; and if you look hard enough, you can almost see the tongue hanging out.


Two of the Christie's employees enter into a discussion. I eavesdrop on their conversation:

Obviously expensive. Very, very rare, indeed." They are in agreement that the *Lineol ambulance* will go high at the sale. For some reason I am disappointed. I had expected to hear them discussing world economics, or Bush-Blair relations, or even last nights fish and chips dinner. Not, *shudder* toys. The room begins to fill with people. Very few are American; most are from the United Kingdom: a woman in an expensive looking gray-striped suit; a pot-bellied man wearing running shoes; and a bald headed man in an ecru sweater and ascot. Each carries their own copy of the Christie's catalogue. All have one thing in common. It is a fervor for collecting. They inspect the lots and smile knowingly at each other. As they walk around the room, each one is aware that the auction is a two-day jousting event. The bidding will be intense, at times over-whelming, yet each must keep his cool. The collectors must learn what is valuable, now, before the war wages.

Another young worker - this time, a pretty blond- walks over to my husband while he is standing inspecting a box. I feel a slight twinge of jealousy as my husband speaks to her. But Tom seems oblivious to her beauty; strongly focused, soldiers are his only interest. *My man.* By now the room is filled with potential bidders. My husband wanders around and finds a friend. "Yes, Francois Beaumont's shop in Paris has the best. But I always call first before going there. You never know what surprises he has in his shop." The other man shakes his head in agreement. "Have you seen lot 174?" the man asks. They seem to know each other. It becomes apparent to me that the collector's world is a finely knit group of 'friends.' A cell phone rings and breaks me out of my thoughts.

Tom is frantically inspecting his 53rd box. Anxiously moving forward he addresses blondie, "Okay, let me see the next lot 182, the Krupp truck," he asks with a strong sense of urgency. A collector wearing jeans and a blue Ralph Lauren work shirt, plops down on the floor next to me. He inspects a box hidden under the table, taking out a pad he writes something. I read over his shoulder- I know this is impolite, but I do it anyway - on the condition of the toy inside. I watch his face as he smiles contentedly fingering a small airplane. That boy-child-look again. "Simply marvelous," he mumbles to himself "marvelous."

At noon, Tom tells me he has had enough. I know in my heart he is lying. For the serious collector, there is never enough. But I accept his decision and we head out for a light lunch at Green's. (I can almost taste the fried cod and mashed peas). After that we have tickets to see a matinee performance of 'Arsenic and Old Lace.' Suddenly, I begin to realize that I am fond of this auction thing. Maybe being a toy soldier widow isn't such a bad thing. After all, some one has to write about it. Right?

Bergen Toy and Novelty Company Beton Plastics Did it pay to advertise?

The history of the Bergen Toy and Novelty Company and it's Beton Plastic Toy Soldier line is well documented in Richard O'Brien's book, Collecting American Made Toy Soldiers # 3. The account ends with an interview given by Harold E Frutchey, General Manager of the company in which he states that Charles Marcak, Bergens owner, decided to sell the company having attended and participated in the New York Toy Fair at the McAlpin Hotel, NY in 1958. This decision was a result of a display of Japanese manufactured copies of the Beton line retailing for far less than the product he had produced post World War two.

During my research in New York City this year, I was fortunate enough to view many old issues of Playthings Magazine, the Toy Trade journal. The accompanying photographs show the great extent to which the Beton line was advertised during the early part of the nineteen fifties, given the deluge of imported figures from Japan, many of which carried no advertising during this time, perhaps the owners of the Bergen Company must have been left to ponder the statement "It pays to advertise".









Further Insights into Britains French Connection by Rob Wilson

Since the last issue various people have contacted the magazine with new information. Much of this is very exciting, providing further insights on the range of figures which Britains offered through their Paris Office.

The Indian Army seems to have been as popular in France as in England, with a number of new types coming to light. These include both cavalry, based on the standard Indian cavalry figure and infantry, using both the smaller and larger castings. The photo illustrates a variation on the Bengal cavalryman, but with a very different paint style to set 47. The casting is without a stamp. The uniform is a pale straw colour with red cummerbund and green turban. Variations with a black cummer bund have also been reported.

Infantry figures based on the larger figure have also come to light, although the paint differences compared to Britains normal offerings are less dramatic, with just subtle variations in the turban. The casting carries a "déposé" stamp, with no reference to being "made in England". According to Joe Wallis in "Armies of the World" (pp 45-47), the larger casting was introduced in 1925, which is after the Paris Office was closed. However, James Opie in "The Great Book of Britains" suggests an earlier date of 1916, which is consistent with the figures being available from the Paris Office between 1916 and 1923.

The magazine has also received some very interesting photographs from Mr. Campbell, whose father had contact with a worker from the factory. These include a number of previously unrecorded items. Unfortunately, Mr. Campbell did not leave a full contact address. It would be very much appreciated it if he would contact the magazine or the author again in order to clarify various details.

Anyone else who has information on this fascinating aspect of Britains production is also encour aged once again to get in touch with the author, so that this information can be more widely shared in the collecting community.

Finally, regarding catalogue material, research and contacts with various museums and galleries in France are beginning to bear fruit. A considerable amount of general material has already emerged, which has thrown light on the kinds of sets Britains supplied to major French department stores. These were of a very different composition to what we have become familiar with. Sets of 6, 12 and much larger groupings contrast with the standard 8 infantry and 5 cavalry sets. There is also the possibility that someone may have some catalogue material relating specifically to Britains output. Watch this space!

Another Dimestore Mystery Solved?

Lincoln Log Snow White and Seven Dwarfs have previously been featured in O.T.S. (see Volume 11, #3, 1987). Richard O'Brien also features examples of the figures in his book *Collecting American Made Toy Soldiers* #3, pages 836-837. The list in Richard's book gives no number for Snow White and an 'eighth' dwarf in the form of a duplicate Happy is illustrated.

Ron Eccles obtained a full set of The Lincoln Log Snow White and Dwarfs at the Antique Toy World Kane County Toy Show in Chicago, June 2003. Upon close inspection,

Ron noticed that Snow White had a number 8 clearly cast on the back of her cape, It seems likely therefore that Lincoln Log made two different sets with and without numbers and possibly with and without names, as





the O'Brien illustrated example of Happy bears no name. Perhaps Lincoln Log remade the set omitting the names and numbers to avoid paying Disney licensing fees.

A nice seven page, full color booklet that provides a brief history of all the participants is included.

Sculpting and detail on all the pieces is nice, crisp and well proportioned. The King Edward Crown held by The Archbishop of Canterbury is very well done. The red and gold cushion, complete with fringe and tassels



With limited production, why not treat yourself and buy two sets-one for display, the other for the future!




LUCOTTE MUSIQUE DES CHASSEURS A CHEVAL

Napoleon called them the "Invincibles". As part of the Imperial Guard they were entrusted with Napoleon's safety and welfare from Marengo to Waterloo. The Chasseurs a Cheval were a vital component of the Imperial Guard cavalry. They were granted special privileges, one of them was the formation of a mounted band.

It is this mounted band that is the newest set issued by the French firm Lucotte, as part of the Lucotte Collectors Club.

The complex history of Lucotte, which began producing toy soldiers in 1840 would be an article in itself. Readers are referred to Lenoir Josey's superb three part series, (OTSN Vol.19,

No.1,2,3), regarding the history of Lucotte and their figures.



This is the first of two six piece sets which will comprise the mounted band. The first set contains a trumpet, fife, cymbals, serpent, triangle and chapeau chinios. Additional figures in any quantity may be ordered to complement the basic set if desired. The figures are simply breathtaking in brilliantly colored uniforms, from their red and blue plumed white colpack, (fur headgear), to their hussar styled boots. Astride white horses with red schabraques, (saddle blanket), and adorned with a red pelisse, (jacket), over their blue dolman, (waistcoat), and ochre pants they are truly one of the most colorful Lucotte sets ever produced.

The quality and historical accuracy of painting is of the highest standard. The intricate braiding on the uniform's, schabraques and sabretaches, (suspended pocket), are stunningly executed. Superb craftsmanship is obvious in the quality of detail in each casting. Over 12 individually cast pieces are required to create one figure. When complete, the figures radiate a unique lifelike appearance, as opposed to figures where these details are simply sculpted on the figure. To insure the highest quality possible, each figure is entirely painted by the same artisan. As a result of this great attention to detail, it takes 3-4 times longer to produce a Lucotte figure. When the set meets the Lucotte standard it is then placed inside the traditional Lucotte red wooden box adorned with the same label used in the 1920's. This superlative set is available only to members of the Lucotte Collectors Club. Upon receiving the announcement of a new set, members are offered a "subscription", (order), which must be placed prior to the published deadline. Once the deadline has expired, the set will never be issued again. A unique feature of the Club is that besides the basic set, additional individual figures may be ordered in any quantity desired.

The partnership of Edouard Pemzec and Lynda Franceschi are responsible for the production of Lucotte figures. 



TOY SOLDIERS SELL BRISKLY AT RALSTON-KURTZ SPRING SALE

Britains and Mignot toy soldiers and miniature figures by Richard Courtenay and Peter Greenhill scored equally well at the Lloyd Ralston-Henry Kurtz Spring Toy Soldier and Figure Auction held on April 26 at Ralston's Stratford, CT. Gallery.

The highlights of the sale included a rare Britains Volunteer Corps Ambulance (right), issued post war only from 1948 to 1956, which sold for \$880.00 after spirited bidding (all prices quoted include the 10% buyer's premium). Among the other highs of the day were a Courtenay mounted figure of the Black Prince (below), which sold for \$825.00; and a Mignot three-tier diorama box of French troops in action during World War I, which also fetched \$825.00.

A wide assortment of pre-World War II and post



Other Britains sets that fared well included a Self-Propelled 155MM cannon on a Centurion Tank Chassis, which was purchased for \$395.00 (estimate \$250 to \$350); a boxed prewar set of the Irish



Guards firing went for \$355.00 (presale estimate \$200 to \$250; a postwar boxed set of Argentine cavalry brought \$330.00 (estimate \$200 to \$300); and a boxed set of the Duke of Connaught's Lancers (circa 1950), which sold for \$300 (estimate \$150 to \$200). An 18-inch Heavy Howitzer mounted for garrison duty (postwar and boxed) went for \$230.00, far exceeding its presale estimate of \$80.00 to \$100.00.

In other categories, a Courtenay-Greenhill special figure of the Comte D'Entempes, (estimated at \$400 to \$500) actually sold for \$740.00; while an original Courtenay figure of the Earl of Nassau went for \$440.00. An unusual World War I period Bosnian Infantry Band (estimate \$150 to \$250) fetched \$310.00; and a Mignot French Alpine Chasseur Mountain Artillery Diorama was bought for \$285.00. Another Mignot set of the Royal

Guard of King Louis XVI (estimate \$200 to \$250) sold for \$350.00. In the Dimestore figure category, a pair of rare army boxers soared past its estimate of \$75 to 100, selling for \$220.00.



VECTIS AUCTIONS - UK 21 May 2003 Record Price For Empty Britains Box

An empty cardboard box from the early 20th century that once contained a set of British toy soldiers fetched 1,265 pounds (including commissions) when it was auctioned by Teesside auction house. Vectis, as part of the Potsdam collection, which saw over 80,000 toy soldiers, sold on May 21st.

The cardboard box which was described as in fair condition once contained a "Charterhouse Sand Bag Encampment" which would have included a supply of sandbags, cannons, tents, soldiers, Union Jack flag and enemy. The enemy in this case, according to an illustration on the front of the box, being a group of the Mahdi's warriors.





"It was very rare and is almost certainly the highest price ever received for an empty toy soldier box" said Peter Rumsey, Vectis's toy soldier expert." The set would have been made around the late 1930's by C E Turnbull under their Charterhouse range.

The sale itself made over 128,000 pounds and the second half when the rest of the collection goes on sale October 15th is likely to make even more.

"The Potsdam" collection of miniature figures was founded in 1928 by Frederich-Wilhelm Meisner, a Lieutenant Colonel in the Imperial guard in Berlin.

Over the next 70 years the collection grew to one of the largest and most important collections of its kind in Europe.

Eventually it comprised of hundreds of thousands of figures, including conventional toy soldiers to flats and semi-flats. These were incorporated into groups and dioramas as well as single regiment displays.

Managed by the same family for three generations, the collection was moved following the reunification of Germany in 1990, to Potsdam, the former seat of the Prussian Kings. An historic 18th century building became the new home for the collection and it was named "Potsdamer Zinnfiguren Kabinett."

The owner of the collection, Dietrich Garski was born in Potsdam in 1931 and he organized and designed several remarkable toy figure exhibitions including "The white men and the other world", a colourful and fascinating demonstration of undiscovered countries by the Europeans. Also the "History of the Theatre in Tin", showing dioramas of the first Egyptian Theatre until the newest prospects of the Salzburg Festpiele 1994.

The centerpiece of the exhibition was a miniature theatre owned by English actor Peter Cushing which included many set changes and figures depicting various wellknown plays.

Peter Rumsey the Vectis toy soldier and figure expert said: "This is an exceptional collection of toy figures and interest was received from all over the World. The collection included many unusual items including German sets by Heyde and French sets by Mignot that very rarely come up for auction.



The Chairman of Vectis, Bryan Goodall said: "This is one of the most important collections of toy soldiers ever to come up for auction."



Other high prices included 380 pounds for a Heyde set of Balkan cyclists, 2,300.00 pounds for a Heyde German S.A. band, 800.00 pounds for a set of Heyde large-scale German Uhlans regiment figures and 6,600 pounds for a Heyde civilian boxed playground set, complete with children, parents and nannies. It was made in 1906.



The Cococubs figures were in near mint condition and were outstanding examples, the colours fresh as the day which they were produced as they have never seen the light of day since the mid 1930's. The Cococubs were produced from 1930 in association with Cadburys Chocolate and used as a promotional item, issued as a gift with every tin of Cocoa. Offered as individual lots prices ranged from \$35-\$90 per Cub.





BOOK REVIEW

THE CRUSADES

By Yli Remo Vallejo Published by AeroArt International Reviewed by Russ Bednarek

When one hears the words "AeroArt", one immediately thinks of the Saint Petersburg Collection figures. Historically correct and painted to the highest standard, these miniatures are in a class of their own.

AeroArts first literary venture, THE CRUSADES, is also in a class of its own. Written by Yli Remo Vallejo with artwork by Russian historical artist Igor Dzis, THE CRUSADES is a wonderfully written, beautifully illustrated history of the Crusades.

Vallejo's text is nice and concise, a daunting task as the Crusades encompassed 200 years! The author does an outstanding job describing each Crusade and its dizzying array of characters. Enhancing the text are what I call "story boxes". Typically, these consist of a half page or column in a different color containing, for example, the biography of a prominent leader or explaining The Military Orders. Vallejo's seamless transition from campaign to campaign results in a smooth flowing text that is easy and interesting to read.


Russian artist Igor Dzis is the perfect match for Vallejo's text. Illustrations are brilliantly executed with flowing action and dazzling color helping to convey the

intense nature of combat. Each chapter begins with a full color double page illustration, followed by numerous smaller renderings. Beyond the 60 color illustrations, (19 full page), 6 battle maps, (in color), there are 6 double page plates depicting the arms and armor of both sides with a descriptive text.

The final 6 pages are comprised of 23 color photographs of Crusader and Saracen figures from the Saint Petersburg Collection.

Given the large format (8"x10 $^{1}/_{2}$ "), 116 pages with 60 magnificent illustrations and superlative text, THE CRUSADES belongs on the bookshelves of anyone interested in this period. At \$30, this quality softcover represents an excellent value.

One can hardly wait for AeroArt's next publication.



BOOK REVIEW UPDATE






PINPOINTING BRITAINS LTD. CHRONOLOGY

By Joe Wallis

What is instructive about the accompanying notice of price reductions for civilian pieces?

The fact that it includes a specific date of September 28, 1931, confirms that: (1) the contents had been produced prior to that time, (2) a prewar catalog that shows a higher price for these items precedes that date unless it is the 1940 catalog, and (3) any listing that agrees with the prices shown for these items was issued subsequently during the 1930s. (Checking several catalogs reveals that these revised prices held through 1939.)

The practice between 1930 and 1935 was for Britains Ltd. to publish separate Farm, Zoo, and Garden catalogs, with the military lines in a main catalog. The pricing can help somewhat in narrowing

down the publication date if you run across one of these separate catalogs for the Farm or the Zoo Lines.


The price list reductions also show that Britains Ltd. was taking steps to mitigate the effect of the Great Slump or Great Depression. Military sets were reduced in 1931 from a retail price of one shilling nine pence to only one shilling seven and one-half pence (a seven percent drop). The selected Farm and Zoo pieces included on the accompanying notice include price decreases amounting to as much as one-third. Such adjustments were undoubtedly necessary to maintain sales, and to compete with competitors such as Johillco, Crescent, and Taylor and Barrett.

FROM DOLLHOUSE TO 'FORTRESS' The military aspect of Moritz Gottschalk's toy world

Part 4: From Father to Son (for the second time) The end of the third era - or the beginning of the fourth?

This last article in the series focuses on the closing years of the partnership of Lina and Kurt Wagner at the head of the Moritz Gottschalk toy manufacturing empire. They had steered the business successfully through the trials and tribulations of the early 1920s, and continued through to 1934 - at which point they handed over the leadership to Kurt's son Alfred.



An illustration of a No.6319/2 from Gottschalk's own catalogue for 1927.


Towards the end of their reign in the second half of the 1920s two new series came on the scene - the 6000 and the 6300. The production history of the first of these is a bit of a mystery and, in fact, the only documentation available is in the 1929 catalogue of Hamley's (1) - the famous toy shop in London. Actually, continuing with the assumption that the Gottschalk numbering system reflected the passage of time (although that relationship is not well

understood), it must have come out somewhat earlier - probably about 1925. On the other hand, quite a lot is known about the 6300 series, examples of which were featured in the Gottschalk catalogues of 1927 and 1929 (2), and appeared in the Gamages' catalogues of 1928 and 1929 (3). It is therefore reasonably safe to



assume that it was launched about 1927.

Both are of particular interest because, in their different ways, considerable attention was paid to the immediate environment in which the forts were set. The 6000 series displays some of the 'film set' character of the range of Elastolin composition forts, which was being developed about the same time by O & M Hausser, while the 'fort-in-a-box' style of the 6300 series is more reminiscent of what one might expect to find on a theatre stage.

The 6000 series.

The 6000 series is not as easily recognizable as other Gottschalk series. There is scarcely any documentation, and the tell-tale number underneath all earlier examples is most often absent. The only two numbered examples known are a quite small one (6204) (4), and a very large one (6087) (5). The others can only be identified as part of the series by their overall style and the use of particular components.

The series is best known through its very large (in size, if not so much in scale), quite complex creations - irregular shapes reflecting natural landscape forms, several levels and usually a number of 3-D buildings (6). The two largest known to this author are more than a yard across and over two feet high, and both use this great volume to accommodate tunnels

underneath capable of taking "0" gauge toy trains (see OTS, Vol 14, No 4, p 6).

There were some medium and small (7,8) examples which were simpler, but even these were more imaginative than their earlier models of comparable size. Most of the smaller ones boast at least a small amount of landscaping, and sometimes a moat with a ramp crossing it by means of a bridge (4,9).



The base The buildings, in an architectural style which can be best described as early medieval, appear to be made to a scale slightly larger than any of the series after 3200. However this did not stop the retention of several elements common to other series - in particular the second store open gallery, with

both the arcaded and the solid masonry lower levels; the ubiquitous small square tower first used in the 4700 series; the large circular tower of the 5200 series; and the medium sized square tower of the 5700 series (see OTS, Vol 25, No 2, pp 36-39, and No 4, pp 28-31).

The larger scale also makes for some buildings to be three dimensional, constructed in the manner of some of the very earliest series like very small dollhouses but without floors inside. There is a consequent greater attention to detail and, while the clever use of stencils to create it remained the same for most of it, some architectural features were now three dimensional - there are examples of exter-

cular towers and some roofs. The bases of the larger castles were covered with quite large chunks of craggy cork, while tree bark, which was the standard before the first World War (after which it was replaced with moulded cardboard), was re-introduced for the smaller ones.

The 6300 series



in the proceedings.

Towards the end of the 1920s a range of Gottschalk forts was introduced, which was completely new in concept. It comprised mostly of much smaller scale forts, which came with their own environment in the form of a box, including scenery and other buildings not totally unlike a theatre with an apron stage.

This was the 6300 series. The front of the box folded down and formed a large part of the front courtyard - probably equivalent to the bailey of a Norman conquest motte and bailey style of fortification. The

two sides and the back formed a setting for the fort (somewhat in the nature of a set in the theatrical sense). The top was really to keep the dust off in storage and folded over behind the backdrop playing no part



The only two examples known are numbered 6319/1 (11) and 6319/2 (12). The castle part of these creations were mostly quite small scale, much smaller than other series, and re-used the components which went to make up a much earlier production - No.5730 (13). It is not

known whether this low 5700 number was an isolated example or one



of a series yet to be identified. However its small scale provided an opportunity, grasped by the designers, to put buildings from their regular forts in the foreground - thus using the perspective effect so created to provide a sense of great depth (14).

Perhaps cashing in on the success of the first in this series, the Gottschalk catalogue of 1929 features another type of castle - in a box with sides which fold out to make it even more theatre-like - which utilizes pieces from the 6000 series (15). This probably made sense in terms of mass production and repetition of compo-





nents, but it created a much cruder effect, and lost the benefit of artificial perspective. Its size and number are not known.

The end of the story

These two splendid series appear to have been the 'last hurrah' for the Gottschalks' supremacy in the production of toy forts - at least outside Germany. In Britain and America examples of their products diminished rapidly as new companies entered the market - such as Lines Bros Ltd of London with their Tri-ang line of toy forts which first

Regrettably, little is known by this author about how it all took place - other than this was the time of the depression in Europe and America - including massive socio-economic change in Germany with the rise of the Third Reich. What is known is that thereafter the company continued through to the early war years and its closure as a private enterprise in 1942.

All in all a depressing end to what had been a glorious seventy years. One wonders what Moritz - the first of the Gottschalk toy fort makers - would have thought about it all.



Toy Soldier Manufacturers Inspirations "The Idea for a Toy Soldier" (Part 1)

When looking through military books, old prints or post cards, we occasionally come across an illustration of a figure that has actually provided the inspiration for the creation of a toy soldier. One only has to review the work of the English military artists Richard Simkin or Harry Payne to discover the uniforms, equipment and poses that inspired so many of the molds of the early British hollowcast makers-Hanks, Fry, BMC, John Hill and William Britains. The artistry of H.A. Ogden also served as the inspiration for the depiction of the American soldier in miniature via his "Pagent of America" illustrations which obviously influ-

Throughout 75 years of the production of hollowcast toy soldiers. William Britains used illustrations in their catalogs and on box lids to promote the sale of their figures. From 1908 to 1930, Fred Whisstock produced some wonderful label art for Britains. On rare occasion Britain's featured the illustration of a figure that was never produced. My conversion of an Officer of the Royal Scots Greys, turned in the saddle to represent the figure on the label for set # 32 is illustrated above.




Raphael Tuck postcard providing inspiration for Bill's 21st Lancers







A PILGRIMAGE TO THE ATELIER DE CBG MIGNOT

We had spent a few days in Paris and collected our rental car from Hertz at the ever so convenient Carillon du Louvre. At about 10:00AM we left Paris and, after the pre-requisite traffic snarls on the Peripherique, we were on the main highway south toward Tours. Virtually, the entire area between Orleans and Angers is known as the Loire Valley, and if you have not done this area before, we strongly urge that you give yourself a couple of days, at the very least, to catch the top chateaux: Chambord, Blois, Chenonceau, Loches and Azay le Rideau. Depending on time, stick to the Michelin Green Guide three star rated Chateaux. A straight drive, as we did it, takes about three

This beautiful Italianate chateau, with an excellent restaurant, beautiful grounds and pool, even has its own chapel, once belonging to Napoleon's Foreign Minister, Talleyrand. The great man probably only spent time here in the company of a mistress but the connection is nonetheless valid. All the rooms are decorated in different themes, many with period pieces. The price varies according to accom-

modation ranging from roughly \$100 per night, per couple up to \$300 for a suite, with very nice accommodations being available in the \$150 range. Do not miss dinner if you stay here as it is some of the finest cuisine in

the region.

The next morning we meandered over small country roads for about half an hour to reach the atelier. As you roll down the final hill and come out of the woods you embrace a beautiful pastoral valley, complete with sheep on the hillsides and a babbling stream down the center. This is the setting for the atelier in La Breille - SEG 075 Volume 26 #3 Page 68 les Pins, France. A map is available on www.cbgmignot.com website. If you do not want to drive down, you can take a train from Paris to Tours for Saumur, and rent a car for the hour drive to La Dreille les Pins.

The atelier is situated here because Monsieur Pemzec, tiring of the congestion in Paris, bought a small 11th century convent here some years ago. As his renovation of the convent proceeded, he moved his technical instrument factory to the nearby village. A few years later, he sold that business to a German dental instrument manufacturer and subsequently bought Mignot out of bankruptcy with his long time friend and accountant Monsieur Grand-Dufay. So it is in this idyllic setting with the convent on the small rise and the road between it and what could have

been one of the convent's original outbuildings, what is in fact now the atelier, this long low story and a half with mansard roof and oval gabled windows to the second floor in the French style. Primary construction is the local field or sandstone. Across the back and the second floor, obscured from the road are great picture windows overlooking the small stream.


As you enter the main door, you find yourself in an office area which has a spectacular color copy machine which is capable of reproducing some of the backgrounds that you see in the dioramas. This is where the younger Pemzec, conducts the primary business of Mignot. To the right is the elder Pemzec's private office which houses the

original desk from Henry Mignot from the mid 1800's. See OTS Volume 26 #3 Fall 2002 Page 69. M. Pemzec's passion extends not only to Mignot and Lucotte, but he also owns the name and molds for the Belgian manufacturer MIM. Today M. Pemzec's primary interests lie in the Lucotte line where he is responsible for two or three sets that come out each year for the Lucotte Collector's Club through Madame Franceschi and her shop, Au Plat d'Etain.

If we may be allowed a little license to divert our attention here, Madame Franceschi's father was the long time production manager for Mignot. Through one of the previous bankruptcies, he purchased and subsequently bequeathed to Lynda, the Lucotte name and label and Napoleonic bee with entwined LC

trademark. But from that and subsequent bankruptcies, Monsieur Pemzec obtained all of the molds for the Lucotte figures. So the two are entwined for production purposes. Mme. Franceschi can't produce anything without M. Pemzec's molds and M. Pemzec can't sell anything with the Lucotte label and trademark without Mme. Franceschi's approval.

As we go to the left we encounter Sylvie, who is the primary expediter. Although she only works three days a week, it is Sylvie who virtually does all of the tying in the box of figures for sets, assembles sets and dioramas, and boxes virtually everything for transshipment to the US and the rest of the world. Just beyond Sylvie is the new showroom which has some of the figures on display but they are usually in incomplete sets and are really meant more as painters' models than to show dealers what's available.

To the right of Sylvie is the mold room where all the molds for Mignot are kept. It is fascinating to see these molds, some of which are literally almost two hundred years old. Until recently, the newest molds were those that were made for the 1947 Israeli troops but now that we have entered what one collector refers to as "The Golden Age" of Mignot, they are producing new prototypes every three or four months. In front of the showroom is

the casting room. Here the mixture of pewter and other metal alloys is heated in an ancient cauldron. A ladle scoops this molten mass out of the cauldron and pours it into the butterfly mold. Almost instantaneously, upon contact with the cold metal of the mold, the butterfly can be opened and out pops the figure. The room beyond this one houses the desk where the molds are cleaned of any residue from the seams and the appurtenances are hand soldered to each piece. If the particular piece is complicated, it could have a separate torso, separate head, separate arms, you name it. While the metal is still soft, the arms can be bent into the appropriate position. Now the figure goes across the little country road to another building which houses the Rube Goldberg paint primer apparatus. This is a system of bicycle chains and pulleys that dangle the figure on a hook and it's turned around while primer paint is sprayed on it. Most of the painting, incidentally, is done back in Paris by an especially highly skilled "tribe" of Vietnamese immigrants. Many traditionalists are happy to learn that the paint used today is of the higher gloss variety than was used in the 70's and 80's.

Since the whole does actually function as an atelier, sets are only made to order. There are no sets available for sale at the atelier. An American collector could pick up an odd piece or two, as long as he has French Francs in cash to pay for it. We might suggest that the best souvenir might be trees or shrubs or actual building facades which are difficult, if not impossible, to portray verbally or by photograph. Prices are higher than in the US because anything sold from the atelier is only sold at a retail level and must include VAT (value added tax).

The real treat is yet to come as we ascend the stairs to the second floor of the main building. Here you will find a painter at work to touch up odds and ends that may have been missed by the Vietnamese painters in Paris. But most importantly, this is where the vast majority of full size dioramas are set up. Arranged down both sides of this second level half story, under a peaked roof, with the French oval side windows, are every manner of diorama. Here you will find the large Gruss Circus, with great canvas Big Top, and over two hundred figures that were produced for the European circus manager at the turn of the century. There is the French fort, reminiscent of a chateau turned into the Maginot line...there is a moat, great battlements, but then you have a wonderful huge turret gun and French 1890's figures completing an exercise. They are wearing their blue/red uniforms and kepis. Some rush to the front on bicycles while others defend the fort. There is the five tier French Foreign Minister, at the turn of the century, Felix Faurre visiting Tzar Alexander in Russia. Now the five tier Franco/Turkish war, with scenes on both land and sea-this was Malcolm Forbes' favorite and brought over \$12,000 when they auctioned his collection from Tangiers. Now a great polo scene with the colonials (in this case probably French) playing the Indian Maharajah's team. A great school house with school yard and the sisters with the little children at play next to a five tier "Jardin d' Acclimation" or children's zoo-a favorite for all ages. Here's a great French Boy Scout Camp diorama with a stream running diagonally across it and tents and trees and camp fires next to a three story firehouse with a brass pole and horsedrawn vehicles, next to a cavalry barracks, also three stories with the horses stabled on the ground floor, the Cuirassiers barracks on the

second floor, and hay and oats and barley stored in the attic. Now we have a two tiered Joan of Arc diorama next to a table model Joan of Arc attacking a fort. Then we have Marie Antoinette's Procession to Trianon on two tiers and Henry IV entering Paris, also two tiers. We have single and two tier religious processional dioramas...in the late 1800's Mignot made all manner of miniature religious accessories-dollhouse size altars with priests and choirboys and small saints. There is a French Foreign Legion fort being attacked by Touregs and then a wonderful two tier Crusades diorama with Saint Louis IX. There is a three tier naval battle at Port Arthur next to a four tier "Chasse a Courre" hunting diorama that shows

men hunting everything from land to sky. A large Algerian oasis complete with a nomad bride arriving on her camel under a gauzy multi colored tent. There is the "L'Attaque sur la Diligence" or American Indians attacking a stagecoach. When I first saw that listed in the catalogue, I thought it was a naval battle and, boy was I surprised when I went back to the atelier and they showed me my Diligence-STAGECOACH! The very rare five tier Cavalry on Manoeuvres and four tier Infantry on Campaign. Some of the newer production dioramas on display include the Napoleonic Ball at Malmaison, two tier Battle of Rivoli, and Egyptian Campaign; table top Battle of the Pyramids. The original 1910 Napoleon camped at Boulogne, and the new two tier Napoleon crossing the Alps into Italy. Two versions of the Cuirassiers Charge at Friedland-one smaller, and one larger version; and the extraordinary Self Coronation of Napoleon at Notre Dame. Over there is the Prehistoric Landscape next to the four tier Gallo/Roman diorama. There is a four tier Sports diorama with everything from snow skiing to motor boat races, La Plage-which is a beach resort that could be in England or France, at the turn of the century. We could go on and on but you get the idea that there is

As we reluctantly leave the atelier, we again encounter the permanent grass trimming goats and sheep. But before we leave the region, it really is a good idea to go by a local winery, built up into the cliffs (in Troglodite territory) where M. Pemzec's major collections are beautifully displayed. In addition to wide ranging antique Mignot and Lucotte displays, you will also find a complete collection of Vertunni,

tremendous variety and probably several hundred dioramas, large and small, in every genre imaginable.

wide ranging antique Mignot and Lucotte displays, you will also find a complete collection of Vertunni, together with the original Vertunni Paris shop sign. There are even sets of figures that were played with by King Ludwig of Neuschwanstein fame and the Last Emperor of China. Perhaps the real prize are some ancient Lucotte figures that were supposed to have been used by Napoleon I to plan battles... of course they ended up as play things for his son, the King of Rome. Incidentally, this winery produces a sparkling burgundy that is not exported outside of France. In fact, the entire region is loaded with small

wineries and if that is to your taste, there are many diversions readily at hand.

As a final note, before you leave the region, you would be well advised to visit the 19th century Cavalry barracks in Saumur and the world's largest Tank Museum, also in Saumur. There is something about seeing captured German tanks, in a French museum, on French soil! This museum even houses Russian tanks. Even if tanks are not exactly your thing, a couple of hours spent here can be very entertaining. The town of Saumur itself is very attractive and if you have traveling companions who are not into militaria, they can have a very pleasant lunch in a sidewalk cafe in Saumur while you ramble around the tank museum. The Cavalry barracks will always have officers or cavalry men exercising their horses, in full uniform. Another sight not to be missed just driving through town. Next time we'll delve a little further into the recent history of CBG Mignot and attempt to dispel some of the myths that have surfaced over the past thirty years.
