





THE COMPLETE WORKS OF ARTHUR FRY & THE ERECTO TOY COMPANY

Fry's first advertisement
The Toy and Fancy Goods Trader - June 28th, 1915

NEW SOLDIER MANUFACTURERS.

Although the past few months have given birth to many new participators in the toy trade, one of the most interesting departures is that made by the Erecto Toy Co., Ltd., of 3-4, Faulkner's Alley, Cowcross Street, E.C. This firm having taken a large factory in South Tottenham of roughly 115 by 30 ft ground area, and having equipped same with extensive machinery, have first concentrated their energies on the production of lead soldiers, with the result that they have now several models ready for the market. After several months experimenting this

firm have discovered the secret of manufacturing the hollow model, and their productions, samples of which we have already seen, are most creditable models in striking attitudes and normal features. Amongst these are featured the Territorial and Cavalryman, the latter of which is made with both sword and lance, whilst another good model is the Guard figured with red coat and blue trousers.

The output of these lines, already considerable, is expected to show a large weekly increase, while other models of popular regiments are already in course of preparation. The Erecto Toy Co. advise us that at some close date they intend turning their attention to the production of wooden toys, and have already one line in the nature of a constructional toy to retail at 1s.


Article published in Toy Shop and Fancy Goods Trader - July 28th, 1915

Following on from my research at the National Archives in Kew London, (see *Old Toy Soldier Magazines* Volume 35 #4 and 36 #1) I was hopeful that I would be able to locate more information on the firms of G.W Wood/John Hill and BMC, (Brushfield Manufacturing Company) to enhance my article, yet despite continuing from where I had left off, no further entries for those companies could be found within the records of 1915.

The 1915 records did however provide a surprise with an entry for Arthur Fry which led me to dig deeper into the archives, hence this article is a combination of previous research into Fry which was published in my book *Old Toy Soldiers 1900-1939 Four Decades of British Advertising* together with the newly discovered registration dates and design numbers found at the National Archives. Most illustrations are taken from the original designs submitted for registration.

Previous reference books and articles have referred to Fry and his Erecto Toy Company as being somewhat of a "Pirate" manufacturer and copying other companies products; this is however, far from the truth. Arthur Fry's designs were original and he was one of the few early makers to register his designs and copyright them. Little has been written on Fry in the past and no definitive record of what he produced has been available. He was however prolific when it came to advertising his products during the period 1915-1917 via the various British Toy Trade magazines including *Games and Toys*, & *The Toy Shop and Fancy Goods Journal*.

Fry attempted to register a design as early as October 1914. It is not known what this was but it probably related to one of his other products as he also manufactured children's wooden building blocks. Fry was listed in Kelly's Post Office Directory in 1911 as A. Fry and Company Electrotypers.

The first toy soldier that seems to have been designed was registered in 1915 and it was that of a charging peak cap infantryman in khaki, this item being illustrated in the first known advertisement for the Erecto Toy Company in The Toys and Fancy Goods Trader of June 28th 1915. The address for the company being given as 3-4 Faulkner's Ally, Cowcross Street, West Smithfield, London EC (Which may have been Fry's home address) with the factory address being Gourlay Street South Tottenham London.

An article in the Toyshop and Fancy Goods Trader of July 28th 1915 carried details of the line of figures that Fry were producing at that time.

Fry's Fighting Soldiers (FFS) as they were known came as single items or in boxed sets including some quite large display boxes, Labels for boxes were illustrated and boxed sets were numbered, Single figures also carried a number in these illustrations from time to time, the following images taken from trade magazines show these. Figures were available fully painted or in gilt.




Shorten Arms is a defensive military position in battle. The London Scottish style figure at shorten arms produced by Fry is believed to be the only toy soldier ever made with this stance.

Lead Pincushion Lion Design #651280, September 8th. 1915

Arthur Fry worked throughout World War One despite a restriction on lead being used for the production toys, which was from time to time lifted by the Ministry of Supply. Fry produced 21 different toy soldiers & figures plus Trench sections with trees and wire barricades during the period March 1915- 30th October 1916. In addition he made metal souvenirs, ashtrays and pincushions, a sample of which is illustrated with his registered design 651280 from September 1915.

Although research is ongoing it seems that the Royal Flying Corps Figure, design number 658225 in October 1916 was his final figure. It is possible that there were further designs made up to April 1921, but according to the London Gazette of April 22nd 1921 Fry was in financial trouble and a meeting of creditors was called by the liquidators. The same publication in August 1925 reported that the Erecto Toy Company was in voluntary liquidation and a final notice to creditors was issued in February 1934 giving a deadline of March that year for any further claims against the company.

During my research there did emerge a possible link between Fry and BMC (Brushfield Manufacturing Company) and G.W Wood/John Hill and Company in the form of two figure designs registered by Fry, the figures were of Belgian Troops and were 60mm in scale rather than 54mm which suggests that Fry made these either for BMC or G.W Wood and to fit in with the scale of those companies figures.



BMC (Brushfield Manufacturing Company) were still in existence in 1921, so these figures could well have been part of their range with Fry sculpting and registering the designs on their behalf.


The original designs are shown in the article dated 5th November 1915, Kneeling Belgian and 16th March 1916 Belgian Stabbing Downwards. Neither of these figures subsequently appeared in any of the Fry advertisements further suggesting that they were issued by one of the other companies above.

Fry's Gentleman in Khaki was influenced by Richard Caton Woodville's well known illustration of a British soldier.





British Government papers of the time indicated the following: "Each Country is required to regulate the use of all protective emblems and names. In the UK, the British Red Cross is the only civilian organisation authorised by the government to use the red cross emblem, unauthorised use may be a criminal offence under the Geneva convention."

Fry's Metal Foundry: An illustration from the same period as Fry was producing showing a Bulldog as part of an advertisement for Fry's Metal Foundry was also used by Arthur Fry, although no concrete evidence is available to suggest Fry and the foundry were connected.




The Toy Shop and Fancy Goods Journal Advertisement, January 1st, 1917. Note the use of individual numbers assigned to items.










Britains Life Guard of 1893

Britains (Now W. Britains /First Gear) celebrate their one hundred and twentieth anniversary in 2013 and as part of their 120th celebration year they continue to maintain their "love affair" with the Life Guard by producing two versions of the 1893 Life Guard which are to be issued this year.

Most toy soldier experts have concluded that the Life Guard issued by Britains in 1893 was probably not actually produced by them and that the fixed arm figure was either of German manufacture or that molds were made in Germany and sent to the UK for distribution by the firm. The Germanic appearance of the figure certainly lends itself to that theory.







BOOK REVIEW

COLLECTING TOY SOLDIERS IN THE 21ST CENTURY

By James Opie • Reviewed by Russ Bednarek



Surprisingly it has been 25 years since James Opie's "Collecting Toy Soldiers" was published in 1987. At that time "Collecting Toy Soldiers" served as a valuable guide to those entering the hobby of collecting toy soldiers. Readers benefitted from Opie's experience, expertise and recommendations on how to put together a quality collection. Chapters guiding future collectors on buying at auction, evaluating figures, detecting fakes and avoiding common collecting errors proved to be most helpful. Since 1987, toy soldiers, like any other commodity, have undergone numerous changes that have been impacted by economic, technological and social influences. Mr. Opie decided it was time to write "Collecting Toy Soldiers in the 21st Century" for the benefit of a new generation of toy soldier collectors.

Collectors should not expect "Collecting Toy Soldiers in the 21st Century" to simply be a re-hashing of Opie's first book. To begin with, the latest book has many physical enhancements of higher standards than it's predecessor; it is a hardback with dust jacket, is 60+pages longer, includes more color photographs and is printed on glossy paper. Every photograph is new as Opie shares some great pieces of his collection with the reader. The subject matter of several chapters does overlap with the earlier version, but this is only natural as many of the basic themes are the foundation of collecting and need to be explored and examined. Readers will find the chapter on identification and

research especially helpful. Mr. Opie provides a list of manufacturers by material, method of production, whether a catalogue was produced and if figure bases were marked. This is done for every type of toy soldier; flats, semi-flats solids, hollowcasts (pre WWI, interwar, postwar), Dimestores, composition, all type of plastics, aluminum and other materials. Current makers also receive their due in a "collectors models" section such as K&C, Del Prado, Britains, St. Petersburg Collection and classics such as Metayer, Courtney, Ping and Greenwood and Ball among others.

It is interesting to read Mr. Opie's opinions as to just what has changed in the toy soldier world in the last 25 years. Among the topics explored are; fewer shops, more shows, importance of the Internet, plastic figures are now considered "nostalgic" and the increase in reference materials. Fortunately many changes have benefitted the collector, the greatest being, in the opinion of this reviewer, the Internet. Unfortunately there are less and less toy soldier stores. We all have our own favorite shop that brings to mind many happy memories (waiting for the Polk's catalogue to arrive!), that is no longer in existence. Plastic figures receive more examination in the new book compared to the first. The author is a proponent of "cameo" collecting; i.e., grouping figures that tell a story. The themes for a collector's cameo are almost infinite. A cameo may be by manufacturer, type of toy soldier, historical period, specific regiment, historical person and so on. The advantage of a cameo collection is that it is usually much smaller (and less expensive) than collecting rows upon rows of Britains, Mignots and others.


"Collecting Toy Soldiers in the 21st Century" would be an excellent gift for the beginning collector or someone who is contemplating entering the world of toy soldier collecting. Mr. Opie's information, suggestions, advice and opinions are spot on and will prevent the reader from being victim to many mistakes that beginning collectors make. Experienced collectors will find the new photographs refreshing to view and will enjoy Mr. Opie sharing with us his numerous collecting anecdotes. Collectors will find the book available at the usual Internet vendors or bookstores. Thank you to Mr. Opie who generously supplied a copy for this review.

But this does explain why you sometimes find poorly cast and terribly painted Lincoln Log figures, especially their cowboys and Indians. The Merchandise Mart address in Chicago must have been their Corporate or sales offices while their factory was most likely in a more industrial part of town.



This RALSTOY military train is the only one I have ever seen although the cannon on a flat car is pictured in O'Brien on page 666. The bottom of the locomotive is marked "RALSTOY" as are most of the larger items made by them.



Dimestore dealer, Rodney Hopson, and I have both discovered some of the early Barclay figures with a completely flat oval base, while the vast majority of this early genre of Barclay's have a concave, oval or hexagonal base. Pictured is a flat-based 2B2 cadet and an unlisted Indian that we assume is Barclay. Anyone else seen any of these?









DIMESTORE UPDATE (Cont.)

Barclay's two inch cars from the 1960's have become quite popular with collectors and several variants have been discovered since I wrote an article on them for OTS, several years ago. Pictured are interesting variants of BV96 "POLICE" car and BV97 (Fire) "CHIEF" car. Previous to this discovery, it was thought that the sirens on this model of vehicle, which included a "TAXI" and a "U.S. ARMY" sedan, had been die cast integral with the roof of the car. Then the variants emerged with a separate slush cast siren that is inserted and glued into a hole in the roof of the car. By sheer coincidence, I noticed that the separately cast sirens were identical to the headlamps on the fenders of the little two inch antique vintage cars of this same 1960's series. My guess is that Barclay started issuing the BV96 and BV97 model cars with the separately cast sirens but found it to be too labor intensive and found that many sirens came loose in shipping and handling. This was the problem with the antlers on the Barclay reindeer which is why there are so many Barclay "does" and so few "bucks" to be found.

I frankly like the models with the separately cast sirens best but they are very hard to find. And the ones with the integrally cast sirens are not easy to find with all of their decals intact. Think about it folks. The 1960's were 53 years ago!









Did you ever wonder how Barclay shipped those man and woman skiers with their skis attached without having them bent or lost? If you ever tried to wrap and pack one of these figures you know how difficult it can be. By pure luck, I came across the pictured original packing box for shipping the man and woman skiers to retail stores. Pretty clever!









A good friend, long time collector and fellow former Marine, Ken Voll, acquired a boxed set of one of Barclay's earliest slush cast freight train sets in pristine condition, at the Chicago Toy Show. He shared the photo with me so I am



sharing it with you. There is still some great stuff out there but you have to dig. In just the last year, I acquired a slush cast Barclay baby crib and the three Barclay Baseball players, all of which are super rare. Good hunting...

BERTRAND AND VERTUNNI- A NEGLECTED FACET OF THE WORK OF GUSTAVE VERTUNNI

The firm Bertrand and Vertunni (B&V) was first established in Paris in 1913 by a Monsieur Bertrand who was later joined by Gustave Vertunni (born in Rome in 1884). Vertunni served in the Italian Army during the Great War (1914-18). According to Christian Blondieau in "Petits Soldats" (p. 181)¹ following demobilisation, Vertunni was not able resume his affairs in France for lack of clientele to purchase his output!

After the war B&V installed themselves in a new company in Belgium (called "La Metallique"), and produced a series of figures representing the various combatants of the war.

Sometimes confused with CBG Mignot, the solid cast figures produced by B&V possess a particular character. The separately moulded heads are often not very firmly hammered into the torso, leading to the appearance of very long necks. More often than not the heads are loose and unfortunately many have lost their heads over the years!

The angled head of the soldiers aiming before firing is also characteristic. Arms were bent to fit particular poses as with the figures made by CBG Mignot. Packs, swords, rifles were moulded separately and soldered into place.

The figures produced were generally well sculpted and painted, as accurate and well done as those by Lucotte and CBG Mignot.

B&V produced a relatively small range of 50-54mm foot and cavalry figures in solid form (cast with a high percentage of lead to make them easily malleable). Some of the horses appear to be hollowcast (although whether this is by accident rather than design is hard to tell, since many appear to be solid). Mainly depicted in service dress, a few figures were also produced in Review order, including various arms of the Belgian Army (including the Chasseurs Cheval (Guides) illustrated here, as well as Grenadiers in full dress sold in Bonhams about 5 years ago.²

Flag bearers and musicians, as well as mounted officers, accompanied the troops. They were made

in both parade ground and action poses. Many of the types were created with a simple change of head, using bodies dressed either in greatcoats or short tunics. Some variety was also introduced by special bodies for types such as Chasseurs Alpins (in jodhpurs, as used for some officers), Zouaves and Turcos (at the trail and in other poses), "goose stepping" Prussians and Highlanders. Most of the main participants in the war seem to have been represented, including Turkey and the various Balkan states. Foot figures appear to be much more common than mounted ones. Some of these types are illustrated in the photos in this article. Others may be found in Blondieau's book, as well as in the archives of auction companies such as Bonhams, when these figures are correctly identified.3

Few boxed sets have survived. The boxes were made of relatively light card and the weight of the solid figures probably soon destroyed the original "homes" of the soldiers contained therein. The 4 row display set illustrated here is a rare exception. The brown paper covered box includes a generic B/V label, with a nice coloured illustration of a French Poilu in relaxed posed. The artist has signed it as Jean Droit. This is similar to the box for a much smaller 12 piece set pictured in Blondieau's book (page 222). Blondieau also illustrates some of the other types described above in his book. The current box has a small label on one of the lid edges containing "Marque B/V" on a shield symbol, as well as "FRANCAIS" in large letters, "déposée" and a typed or stamped code number (5049). All of this is in blue print apart from the code number stamped in a different shade of blue ink. The main label also emphasises "FABRIQUE PARISIENNE".

After the death of Bertrand, Vertunni moved on to develop his more well known 60mm historical personality series around 1930, returning to France around 1935.





SOREN BRUNOE; DENMARK'S MASTER MODEL SOLDIER MAKER

By Henry Kurtz

In the early 1980's, while on a press tour of the Scandinavian countries, I had the great pleasure of meeting and becoming friendly with Soren Brunoe, who reigned supreme at the time as Denmark's master model soldier maker and creator of brilliantly crafted and painstakingly researched dioramas of historical events. John Garratt, who was the dean of model soldier authorities for many years, considered Brunoe (who used the trade name "Rollo") "one of the leading model figure makers of the world.

Admirers of his work point to mini-masterpieces such his "Richelieu on the dike at La Rochelle." Based on a painting by Henri Matte, it shows Cardinal Richelieu standing on the dike he had built to prevent an

English fleet from reinforcing the city of La Rochelle, a stronghold of the rebellious Huguenots. From the perspective of the cardinal, the enemy fleet, a painted backdrop by Brunoe, can be seen foundering in the rough seas. Near the cardinal stands his clerical staff.

Many of Brunoe's dioramas were inspired by period paintings. A particularly stunning grouping depicts the Battle of Fontenoy (1745), as seen from the French lines, and closely duplicates a painting by French artist Paul Philoppoteaux, whose most famous work is the massive Cyclorama of the Battle of Gettysburg. Both the painting and Brunoe's three-dimensional rendering of it shows the moment when the commander of the French royal guards - seen lifting his hat - refuses the British offer to let his troops fire the first volley. Legend has it that the French officer replied, "Oh no, sir, you may fire first." The British obliged, decimating the French lines with their musketry.

Of course Brunoe also worked from his own ideas. As a case in point we have an 18th Century drawing room scene that features two brilliantly costumed ladies in the midst of a quarrel. A gentleman has intervened and is trying to separate them. Off to the right a chambermaid is so startled that she drops her tray.

What follows is a sampling of some of Brunoe's individual pieces and small groups, all showing the characteristics of a fine painter and sculptor (he was a portrait artist and Denmark's leading painter of maritime subjects.) First we have a solo figure of a semi-nude "Marianne" drumming into battle her fellow French revolutionaries. Next is a figure of Piper Findlater of the Gordon Highlanders, sprawled

on the ground wounded in both legs, piping his comrades to victory at Dargai Pass in India in 1898. Following that is a vignette of English troops resting after the 1706 Battle of Odenarde. Another masterful small diorama that fuses painted backdrop, scenic props and figures shows Madame Du Barry, mistress of French King Louis XV, being denied access to the royal grounds by guards instructed to detain her by the Dauphin.

So we end this small catalogue of Soren Brunoe's work. Sadly he has passed from the scene, but happily his work lives on in the collections of those fortunate to have examples of his unique model figures.

BRITAINS SET #2011 ROYAL AIR FORCE DISPLAY BOX

By Joe Wallis



Set 2011 was one of Britain Limited's most imaginative and well-designed display boxes. The first announcement of this set appeared in the 1948 New Lines List, as the firm tried to sustain its prewar status as one of Great Britain's most successful toy manufacturers.

Comprising an assortment of 22 pieces tied into three rows in a ROAN labeled box, Set 2011 retailed for \$5.95 at first, eventually increased to \$6.50 by 1954. There was an officer walking with a document. The casting was from the Militia/ Home Guard figure and his arm was the same as the Home Guard officer from Set 1918, but his uniform was RAF blue and he wore a peak cap. The motorcycle dispatch rider employed the same casting as the Royal Corps of Signals motorcyclists from Sets 1791 and 1907, but in an RAF blue uniform. There were two pilots walking with parachutes on their backs and two Women's Royal Air Force (WRAF) in skirts from Set 1894. Two firefighters in white asbestos suits came from prewar Set 1758, while the aviator standing with arm akimbo in an olive-drab Sidcot suit was first issued in prewar Set 333. In addition, there were two flight sergeants in long overcoats from prewar Set 331, along with three aircraftsmen in short tunics with side caps—that one is an officer can be seen from the light blue cuff rings on his right

arm—all from prewar Set 330 and the final prewar version of Set 240. Many of the aforementioned pieces also appeared briefly in prewar Set 1906, but the final eight pieces consisted of six of the Royal Air Force Regiment with berets marching with slung rifles, one marching at the trail holding a Bren gun, and an officer with a swagger stick. They were based on the Airborne Infantry of Set 2010 that was also introduced in the 1948 New Lines List. (For more on the history of the RAF Regiment that was formed to defend airfields, see my article in *The Old Toy Soldier*, Volume 10, issue 3, pages 7-9.)

17 of the 22 figures in Set 2011 were dressed in RAF blue; only the two firefighters, the two olivedrab pilots, and the pilot in the olive-drab Sidcot suit were not. While no new castings were used, the variety offered in Set 2011 was exceptional. This diversity was underlined by the fact that no fewer than seven of the pieces were also included in the Picture Pack Series when that line was offered between 1954 and 1959. The RAF Picture Packs were: 66-B Pilot in Sidcot Suit, 587-B Firefighter in asbestos suit, 1054-B Pilot walking in full equipment, 1055-B Women's Royal Air Force, 1149-B RAF Regiment officer with baton, 1150-B RAF Regiment airman with slung arm, and 1151-B RAF Regiment Bren gunner marching at the trail.

It is mystifying why Britains did not incorporate Picture Pack 1081-B, the RAF Air Commodore standing with his coat over his arm, into Set 2011, but they never did. Britains also never bothered to produce a single-row box with just the RAF Regiment.

Even though Set 2011 was a first-rate display box with great appeal and play value, it was only produced from 1948-1959. Its logical companion, Set 2052 Anti-Aircraft Unit, also lasted just eleven years, from 1951-1962, even though it was more expensive than Set 2011. Plastic would triumph over lead, but there was never again a Britains set containing such a wide and interesting assortment of figures as Set 2011.





BRITAINS CORSAIRS - INDIAN BANDIT AN UPDATE FROM THE OLD TOY SOLDIER MAGAZINE ARCHIVES

By Norman Joplin

Old Toy Soldier Magazine carried the following illustration and report in the April/May 1995 issue Volume 19 # 2.





Britains Paris factory is notable for many models and paint styles not sold in the British catalogue, but it has been many years since I have seen a totally new Britains figure, not derived from known Britains castings.

Such a figure has now come to light, in the shape of the Britains Corsair. He is a sturdy Barbary Coast pirate with a turban and waistcoat, wielding a long scimitar on a moveable arm and holding a short knife (or possibly a pistol) in the other fixed arm. The pose is reminiscent of the Britains Chinese with the knife, thus giving a possible origin for that figure, having been designed late in the Paris production period and never issued in Paris before the 1923 shutdown.

The Corsair is presented in three color schemes, combinations of the red or white waistcoat, the red or yellow sash, and the green or blue skirt in which he is attired. Two wicked curved knives are tucked into the sack at his waist. The face and forearms are dusky brown, with the eyes white with a black dot in the centre, as with the King's African Rifles, another set contemporary in origin.

The newly discovered Corsairs, a group of thirteen figures, go on sale at Phillips Bayswater on 27 June 1995, estimated at £2,500-£4000. The eventual hammer price was £4485.

UPDATE 2013

Several new pieces of information have come to light since this article was published.

The Phillips Bayswater London auction of 1995 described the illustrated Corsair as being a Britains Paris Office item, although no substantiating evidence was given in the press release or the catalogue. It was likened to a Barbary Pirate but no mention of the figure bearing a *Depose* mark was included in the press release.

Several years ago whilst in conversation with the late K. Warren Mitchell, it transpired that Warren had received a gift from a prominent US Collector of the solid Master Figure of the Corsair. The weapons were not attached to the figures, see front and back images below, showing that the items has moveable arms. Since no Master


Figures of items made in by the Paris Office have come to light. It seemed unlikely that the Corsair was part of the French factory's output.

While researching for my forthcoming book-Behind the Scenes at the Britains Toy Soldier Factory I came across an entry in the Britains Factory Records under the master mould list heading which described the item as an Indian Bandit with the mould number of 424. As these records in my

possession only refer to items made in the London Factory it seems unlikely that the Corsair was a Paris office figure. As correctly stated in the Phillips article from 1995 the Corsair does resemble the Chinese Infantryman from Britains Set # 241,for which the records further state that the "working" name for that figure was Chinese Bandit, Mould Number 610,an illustration of the Chinese figure is shown here for comparison.









A similar Barbary style Pirate by the French company of G.M. is also shown next to the Corsair.


