



## THE DURSO COMPANY "BANDITS"

Brief History of the Company

The Durso Company, a Belgian manufacturer of excellent composition figures, started production in Leige, Belgium in 1938, and although the factory doors closed in 1972, its founder and owner, Michel Klimov, continued to produce "special orders" in his home until 1988.

For this remarkable achievement of producing exceptional composition figures for fifty years, Mr. Klimov was awarded the Belgian Government's prestigious "Medal of Leopold III."

#### The Bandits

The "Bandits" was one of many "series of figures" produced by Durso. We have discussed several other Durso series in previous OTS articles. In retrospect, it is seen that this production of Bandit figures followed a very logical progression that complimented other figures very well.

By analyzing catalogs through the years, we note that in 1946, a new series of "Indians" (American), was introduced. This was followed in 1947 by the introduction of a series of "Cowboys", and in 1954 by the "Mounties" (Royal Canadian Mounted Police.)

The "Bandits" initially appeared on the scene in 1948 with just a couple of figures

The series expanded in 1949 with the introduction of five (5) additional figures.

This was the extent of the series until 1965 when seven (7) additional figures were introduced.

At this point, we must state that the last known catalog issued by Durso was in 1961. However, the production of new figures to compliment existing series continued into 1965 and most probably beyond. Mr. Klimov essentially used the same basic figures, altered by specific uniforms, colors, and accessories, to produce new Cowboys, Mounties, and Bandits.








## PETER JOSEPH BLUM FOUNDER OF THE SOLDIER SHOP

On January 16, 2003, Peter J. Blum, proprietor of the Soldier Shop passed away. Peter had been ill for the past several years. Yet it hardly seems possible that it was 10 years since the shop closed its doors for the last time.

In 1968, I had just rented an apartment located at 78 street and Madison Ave. I was soon to discover that the The Soldier Shop was to my delight, located in the same building. The shop was handsomely appointed with paintings and prints on the walls. Militaria displayed throughout. A glass cabinet stocked with Imrie/Risley figures stood to the left of the entrance. The cabinet behind the shop window was reserved for the old Britains, Mignot and Heydes. I received a lot of kidding from the staff because of my interest in the toy soldiers.

Peter was raised on Manhattan's Upper Eastside and then attended Deerfield Academy in Massachusetts. Peter did military service in the Air Force, then returned to New York to work at CBS News before opening The Soldier Shop in 1965 with a staff that included Richard Rhein, Dane Knell and Iris Outwater. In time, I became resident toy soldier sorter. Back then we all looked forward to the MFCA convention held at PMC in Chester, Pa. each March and the New York Military Historical Society event held at the 7th Regiment Armoury during the Holiday Season. The dinners were great fun, colorful tales of World War II, told by the veterans who attended. Many of the attendees were also members of The Company of Military Historians, an organization that Peter had served as president. In 1983 the shop moved to a new location at 88th and Madison Ave. and remained there for 10 years, staffed by Bob Shepps and Ed Lober.

An era has now ended with the passing of Peter Blum. Today there are shows almost weekly, and numerous shops across the country. Much is owed to those who opened the path that we now enjoy.

The show is sponsored by the South Florida Collectors Club and fills the entire second floor of the West Palm Beach Holiday Inn. In its ninth year, the club has leveraged the warmth of sunny Florida in February to entice all

Many manufacturers of new toy soldiers were present. Mike Laeding from Trophy of Texas is shown here with one of his top




Barry Carter has once again resumed the role of organizer and promoter for this event, held each Spring in the Sheraton Hotel at Keystone Crossing.

As usual, promoter Rick Berry and the folks from the Michigan Toy Soldier Co. did an outstanding job of organizing and promoting the event.

The very first year of the show, when it was held in Ann Arbor, there were 5 inches of wet snow the morning of the show. Yet stalwart collectors from all over the area came in droves, despite the bad roads, to kick-off the inaugural staging of this premier toy soldier event. The following year it was moved to its present venue, where it continues to thrive, now in its seventh year.

Show organizer Rick Berry continues to put on a "class" show, with an incredible variety of toy and miniature figures on offer. This year, the banquet room contained nearly 100 tables, displaying a wide variety of both new and vintage merchandise. 

### BRITAINS LILLIPUT 'THE LITTLE PEOPLE' Part one

By Philip Dean

If you are to believe the reference guides and books used by many collectors today then Lilliput appeared at the time of the 1950 catalogue supplement and was elevated to the main catalogue for the first time in 1952. These figures were manufactured, under license from Britains Ltd, in association with W Horton Ltd. The individual figure was 21mm tall so as to be compatible with "OO" and "HO" gauge railway.

The Britains 1952 catalogue implies that some of these figures had already been in production for some time and Britains had manufactured a series of railway and civilian figures. But the production of the figures for the 1952 list was by Hortons, not Britains. The 1959 catalogue claims the earliest numbers in the series were introduced nearly a quarter of a century earlier.

G. Smallwood, head of Britains model shop, or to give it the full title, The Engineering, Machine and Tool Room Department, kept a meticulous record of work done during the years 1932-41. These became known as "The Smallwood Notebooks" (see OTS April 1984) Detailing the production of the original moulds and castings made during this time and giving the total hours worked on each figure.

Between March and August 1937 a series of some twenty items were recorded in the books, being all railway related items, produced by Britains, especially for Trix.



This photograph shows the Main entrance steps (Trix ref 92) and the double seat with station nameplate (Trix ref 142). A single seat (141) and single steps (191) were also produced by Britains until 1953.

Britains were making, for Trix Twin Railways, two sets of steps for their railway stations. The single steps (Trix ref.91) and the Main entrance steps (Trix ref 92) These steps were made to go in front of the Trix "Many-Ways" buildings. Both were made by Britains until 1953 and are included in the Trix 1939 catalogue, both were marked "Britains TTR Made in England" on the base. During the same period a single seat (Trix ref 141) and a double seat with a station nameplate (Trix ref 142) were also supplied by Britains. They also carried the same legend on the base.

The figures produced, with their (later) Lilliput numbers were, Nurse & child (LB517) Porter with trolley (LB533) Guard (LB534) Station Master (LB535) Porter with luggage (LB537) Newsvendor (LB538) Lady with case (LB539) Man with book (LB540) Man with umbrella (LB541) Lady with hatbox (LB542) Golfer (LB543)

The merchandise and platform equipment was Barrel (LB544) Hamper (LB545) Large packing case (LB545) Small packing case (LB547) Electric trolley (LB549) and the black trolley with the wire handle which was exclusive to Trix and had no Britains model number.

Within the notebooks, recorded is the time taken, in hours, to work the details of the masters created by the modelmakers and for such small figures the input is enormous, the porter with luggage was allotted 18 hours, whereas the station master took just 12. The small hamper recorded a time of 120 hours to produce this relatively simple masterpiece. The barrel, 37 hours, the packing case, 97 hours and the large seat 73 hours.

According to the "History of Trix", a superb book by Tony Matthewman, the range of Lilliput people and railway accessories was established, by Britains, in the mid 1930's, just before they were asked, by Trix, in 1937, to provide them with similar figures. Sold in small red boxes they all showed the TTR logo, the Britains trademark, and the legend, "Made specially for Trix Ltd by Britains Ltd" There is little

to distinguish pre-war from post-war figures, but the porter wore a red jacket and the newsvendor, a white coat, pre-war only. The golfer would be grey and the guard would have his bag and strap coloured in brown. The small four wheeled hand trolley, with a wire handle, was also only made pre-war and was never in the Britains range.



It is not always possible to say which figures were made either pre or post war, these 5 are all prewar only. The newsvendor (first left) was no available in white post war. The porter (second left) only wore a red jacket prewar. The man with the book and the golfer were available only in brown post war. The guard had the satchel and strap highlighted in brown prewar and was painted completely blue post war.

In the period 1937-39 Trix offered five sets of figures and merchandise / equipment.

### 101 - Railway personnel with 7 figures

Introduced in 1937 this set contained the Station Master, Guard, Newsvendor, Porter with bags, Porter with barrow (2 pieces), Barrow or Porter.

### 105 - Platform equipment and merchandise - 20 pieces.

Also introduced in 1937, this set started with 12 pieces, two each of the large and small packing cases, hamper, barrel and trolley with an electric trolley and 4 wheel hand trolley. In 1938 this was made a 20 piece set by increasing the cases, barrel and hamper to 4 each.

### 111 - Passengers - 7 figures

The six passengers in 1937, with a random extra in 1938 making a total of seven.

### 125-Passengers- 15 figures

Made of 12 passenger figures in 1937, with an extra three added in 1938.

### 131 - Merchandise - 12 pieces

Both packing cases, the hamper and the barrel a total of nine in 1937, increasing to twelve in 1938.

These were all one shilling and twopence or two shillings and four pence per set That's old English £sd - you work it out! They were not re-issued post-war.

Post-war there were three new sets containing fewer figures than the pre-war, sets 100 - 110 - 130. These sets had identical contents to the three Lilliput sets, LP 510-511-512. Which were introduced a fixed years later.

Set 100 (Lilliput LP510) contained the Station Master, Guard, Newsvendor, Porter with bags and the porter with barrow(trolley). Produced by Britains for Trix from 1948-1952.

Set 110 (Lilliput LP511) was the passengers, Nurse and child, Golfer, Man with book, Woman with case, Woman with hatbox, Man with umbrella (1948-1952)

Set 130 (Lilliput LP512) Electric trolley, Barrow and two each of Barrels, Hampers and the large and small packing cases. (1948-1952)

These three sets were advertised in the 1949 "Polks" catalogue at .95c each!



These are the sets made by Britains for Trix post war sets 100 - 110 - 130, identical to the Lilliput sets introduced later.

It must be noted that all the 21mm figures sold under the Trix banner had no Britains 54mm alternative, unlike the farm figures introduced by the Lilliput range of the 1950's and were, presumably, made specifically for Trix.

So, we now know that the Lilliput range of railway figures were manufactured by Britains, and sold under the Trix name, nearly two decades before W Horton Ltd came onto the scene and the hunt and farm series were introduced, but that's another story.

# Outer Space Adventures The Mysterious Inhabitants of the Marte Space Ship

Recently, I acquired an incredible wooden space ship made by craftsmen at the Juguete Denia factory in Denia, Spain. Denia is a seafaring town on the Mediterranean coast just below Valencia and toys (juguetes) were produced at the factory as early as 1904.

This spacecraft is an enormous twenty-two inches long, four inches high and nine inches wide. The fuse-lage of this superbly sculpted ship is turquoise with two large harvest gold engines, trimmed in red and black attached to either side. The finish has remained

glossy after all these years. *Marte*, Spanish for *Mars*, is stenciled in a red and yellow bamboolike font on either side of the nose cone. Red and yellow arrows made to look like lightening bolts decorate the top of the ship. The four wheels that propel the spacecraft are reminiscent of those found in early Meccano sets - metal rims with well-articulated, rubber tires. When the ship blasts off (on the floor that is), a mechanism connected to the front wheels turns the imposing brown and black space cannon from side to side. A brown antenna composed of a cone-shaped block with two protruding thin-gauge wire pieces is attached

on top of the main platform.

The seller, Maria Jesus Navarro Lopes, recounted that her father, Rafael Navarro, was given the space ship as a gift in Spain in 1935. The toy has been in her family ever since. Ms. Lopes mentioned that while the ship was factory-produced in limited quantity she has yet to see another.

As an avid collector and researcher of space toys, another aspect of this toy intrigued me. The accompanying photos show three figures standing inside the ship. All three 60 mm poses are identical to those made by *Tudor Rose* in the 1950s with two exceptions

- they are made of rubber (and not the usual hard plastic) and painted. The consistency of the rubber is similar to that used by the Welsh-based company *Poplar Plastics* in their spacemen of the early 1950s. The ravages of time and heat have hardened and distorted the rubber marching figure at the stern of the spacecraft. After over 65 years, that figure is now engaged in a bizarre form of Martian Limbo. The two figures at the bow of the ship, however, are still standing tall. The figures are painted in either maroon with gold trim or blue with gold trim and each face is nicely detailed. Remarkably, while the paint has

dulled to some extent, none has flaked off. Two of the three figures sport space helmets similar to those used by *Tudor Rose* and all appear to be attached to the ship with glue. To my knowledge, no other loose rubber figures of this type have surfaced.

While conducting research for *Blast Off* the evidence suggested that during the early 1950's, Tudor Rose copied three of the Archer (75mm) and one of the Premier (60mm) space figures to form its set of four, 60mm figures. The four poses




Rear view of the Marte space ship.

mave been found together on bubble cards bearing the *Tudor Rose* label but I am guessing they were also sold individually as bin toys. These four figures were also pantographed in 40 mm scale and often found with Australia's Moldex spaceship.

The surfacing of this spaceship and these figures raises some intriguing questions. For instance, were the three figures attached to the ship when it was produced? Ms. Navarro is adamant about ship's lineage because of its close ties to her family history, but she does not have any clear recollection regarding whether the space figures were added later. Because the figures are made of rubber it could be the case that

hard and soft plastic from Australia, Hong Kong, Italy, Great Britain and now potentially Spain. What is fascinating is that our understanding of the web of influence of the Archer and Premier figures still has not been fully determined. However, with every new find we come closer to developing a more complete understanding of these interrelationships. But for now the question remains: Who are the mystery men that inhabit the Marte space ship?

they predated similar plastic figures. And, if the figures are original to *Marte*, was Robert Genin, president of Archer Plastics and to this point considered the progenitor of mass-produced space figures, influenced by them? I posed this possibility recently to Gloria Genin Lester, Robert's ex-wife, but she maintained her strong belief that Bob (now deceased) was not influenced by any European figures and was the first to produce what we now call the Archer space men.

One thing we have established is that Archer and Premier (and also those made by AJAX) space figures were copied worldwide from the 1950s through the early 1970s. In my collection, I have numerous variations in







# RECONNAISSANCE

#### **NEW PARIS OFFICE TYPES**

Thanks to Michael Proctor of Newtown, Connecticut, USA, for a prompt response to the request for information on Britains Paris Office types in the article by Rob Wilson and Norman Joplin in the previous issue.

Michael supplied the photograph attached, showing what appears to be an example of a Paris Office version of set 114, the Cameron Highlanders marching at the slope. They are based on the figure without back pack introduced in the British market in 1916. The figures (a matching set of 8) are very similar to the normal English one, with three exceptions:

- The figures carry a rifle with fixed bayonet and loose rifle sling;
- The painting style shows some slight variations on the normal English version, most notably with a characteristic inverted v- shaped moustache;
- The base is stamped depose, but excludes any reference to being made in England.

The latter certainly indicates that the casting the figure uses was at some time sold through the Paris Office, although the author has many other examples with similar base stamps that are obviously NOT Paris Office types. It is

clear that Britains reused many of these moulds and castings back at Lambeth Road, after the Paris Office was closed down.

The other distinctions, while not conclusive, are certainly consistent with the figures having been produced in France. Unfortunately the known provenance for the set provides no further confirmatory evidence of this conjecture.

Michael's response was one of a number or replies to our request for new information. These have included material on boxes and other matters. How many more examples of Paris Office production lie hidden away and unrecognized? Hopefully, this article may prompt others to follow Michael's example and share their finds with fellow collectors.


#### TOMMY TOY UPDATE

Richard O'Brien

Re the Tommy Toy nursery rhyme pieces: When I saw them at Stanley Goldsmith's home, I assumed they were experiments by Barclay, an experiment that was careful to leave out the "Tommy Toy" underbase markings. Since there were no originals there, I had no way of noticing that the unpainted castings were larger. So maybe Toy Creations-American Alloy experimented, but to me there's a look about the metal, at least in the photo, that suggests it might have been H.B. Toys that did the experimenting. Their figures often ballooned in size due to the crudeness of the alloy. Since I never heard anything from anybody at Barclay about Barclay's obtaining pieces from American Alloy-Toy Creations or H.B., it could have been either. However, since none of their known figures (by either of these companies) were in Goldsmith's collection, there's another possibility; that Barclay's Frank Krupp came up with some inexpensive molds so that Barclay could cast a few pieces and show them to buyers. And perhaps those temporary molds contaminated the metal, or an imperfect alloy was used. In any event, this seems to have been a one-time experiment by whoever did it, as no duplicates have as yet turned up.

# **AUCTION REVIEWS**

### **Vectis Auction: Miele, Part 2**

Following the great success of the first part of Bill Miele's collection in December 2002, as reported in the previous issue of OTS, collectors were awaiting Part 2 with eager anticipation.

The sale took place on the 5th of March 2003, in Buckingham, England. Unlike the previous sale, this was not so well timed to coincide with the London Toy Soldier and Figure Show. As a consequence, there were not so many US and other foreign buyers present, although the phone lines were hot, with many overseas bidders.

Part 2 comprised a mixture of both boxed and unboxed sets, plus Bill's collection of Britains master models. While not containing as many extremely rare sets as Part 1, there were plenty of very desirable items on offer, including a number of

Britains/Hugar buildings. The latter gen-

erally went for a little over the top range of the estimate.

Other highlights included a boxed Britains Set 93, Display of Royal Horse Guards and Coldstream Guards, which was knocked down for £2500 (\$4000). There was also a very unusual "British Services " display set, in its original box, as sold in Gamages, London, in the late 1930s.



This contained a range of 29 RAF, ARP and AA figures. This very unusual item went under the hammer for £1500 (\$2300).

A number of

unboxed items were sold, including some highly unusual Britains "special paint" sets. The pictures attached illustrate examples, including Colour Parties of the Royal and Welsh Fusiliers and a colour bearer of the Rajput Rifles.

In addition to figures from the Miele collection a number of other interesting items changed hands, including an extremely rare Paris Office boxed set, which sold for £3000 (\$4500).

## Gorringes Auction, Sussex England March 12th 2003

Gorringes is a well established Antique and Fine Art Auction House, based in Lewes, on the South Coast of England, specializing in old furniture, paintings and general collectibles. It does not usually figure on the itinerary of Toy Soldier collectors. This all changed when they took in a large single owner collection of mainly Britains figures at the turn of the year.

Although a few sets were in original boxes, most were not. This set a daunting challenge for a non-specialist auction house. They had to catalogue what turned out to be over 120 substantial lots. Despite these difficulties, they rose to the challenge and managed to bring order to the chaos.

A number of collectors and dealers turned up on the morning of the sale, hoping to have been the only ones to have heard about the collection (including the author!). Unfortunately, in these days of modern technology, there are few secrets in the auction business nowadays. So, while some reminisced about the "good old days" (when lots containing multiple sets of rare Britains could be had "for a song"), all present had to accept the reality of another highly competitive auction.

Telephone bidders competed with those in the room for a number of good and hard to find sets. Most lots sold for well above the rather modest estimates, which had attracted buyers with the hope

of a bargain

Highlights included a boxed Scout Display set, (knocked down for £800 /\$1200, including commission), a boxed Household Cavalry "Musical Ride" (£450 /\$700), together with a number of other good boxed sets.

Unboxed items featured a US Army Band in Summer Dress (£800 /\$1200) and a 28 piece Bahamas Police Band in only fair condition (£800 /\$1200). NORM, THESE PRICES ARE GUESTI-

MATES!!

Despite this, hope springs eternal. Had anyone else spotted the treasures hidden in lot 1063? This was described in the catalogue as "Britains Household Cavalry, various dates and types", and estimated at £150-250. Unlike most of the other lots, which were neatly laid out, set by set, on the table tops, lot 1063 was piled into a large box, in a corner, under a table. Getting down on hands and

knees revealed that it contained around 70 mounted figures, together with some original boxes.

Unfortunately (for the author at least) a couple of bidders had noticed that these were not all run of the mill Life Guards! Bidding shot rapidly over the top estimate, with the hammer eventually coming down at £1600 (\$2400).

And what was the cause of all the excitement? The attached picture tells the story - why just set 72, "Life Guards Past and Present"!

And the moral of the story? I guess that prices tend to find their own level!

# **BOOK REVIEW**

# The Honourable Henry N. R. Jackman Collection of Toy Soldiers in the Royal Ontario Museum

by K. Corey Keeble Published 2002 by ROM, 304pp. Reviewed by Geoffrey E. Duin

This well researched "coffee table" size book presents the nearly 5000 piece toy soldier collection donated to the Royal Ontario Museum(ROM) by Henry Jackman. Although the collection is predominately made up of pre-1966 Britains Ltd. lead figures, the book should appeal to most toy soldier fans. Its best feature is the all color photos of the various sets, figures and vehicles depicted at 80% of their actual size, so you won't need a magnifying glass to see the real charm of these old toys, right down to the chips and scratches on their paintwork.



Collectors of old Britains will especially appreciate the full-page photo spreads that include both the sand and olive colored versions of the Centurion Tank, set 2150, and the 155 mm. Gun, set 2175. There are also full page photos of many of the band sets including the Highland Pipe Band of the Black Watch, the US Military Band; set 2110, both versions of the US Marine Corps Bands, the Royal Berkshire Band, and a 28 piece set 2186; Bahamas Police Band. Photos of both versions of the Royal Army Service Corps Wagon; sets 146, and 146-A are laid out on a half page each, as are set 203; the Royal Engineers Pontoon Section, and set 1330; the General Service Wagon.

Jackman put together most of his collection during the late 70s to mid 80s(arguably the "golden age" of Britains collecting), and the range of sets he acquired is impressive. For example, the book's index is arranged by set number rather than alphabetically, starting with set 1; the Life Guards and ending with set 2186. While there are gaps in the collection, notably Britains "Famous Regiments Series" (numbers 1556 through 1602) produced in the 1930s, the Agincourt series, and some of the very rare sets, the collection is extensive enough to make this book a good reference to much of Britains pre-1966 production line.

The book is divided into three major sections: "Great Britain", "Empire and Commonwealth", and "Armies of the World". These sections are further divided into the subheadings like "Territorials", "Khak Troops", and "Bands", and country headings under Abyssinia to Zululand. The various types of the British Army are grouped by Household Cavalry, Cavalry of the Line(Dragoon Guards, Dragoons, Hussars, Lancers), while the infantry regiments are divided into Foot Guards, Infantry of the Line, Fusiliers, and Rifle Brigades.

Along with the set name and number listed in numerical order there's a notation of where the set was acquired with the name of the retail shop or auction house, and includes the auction date, and the sale and lot number; valuable information for obtaining particular auction catalogs.

Following this there's a detailed description of the set. Keeble used four main reference works for his set descriptions: James Opie's "Britains Toy Soldiers 1893-1932", Andrew Rose's "The Collector's Guide to Toy Soldiers", John Ruddle's "Collector's Guide to Britains Model Soldiers", and Joe Wallis's "Regiments of all Nations". Keeble has acknowledged that he was especially indebted to Rose's book, which was the first book to feature color photos of toy soldiers that are almost to scale.

The set descriptions includes information like uniform and facing colors, horse and figure poses with changes noted, production periods, (Keeble is careful to note where the above books differ regarding points like this), and the number of figures in a set at various periods. For example, the following is an excerpt from the description of Britains set 1513, Volunteer Corps(St. John of Malta)Motor Ambulance and Crew: "Set 1513 came out in the late 1930s. It used the same motor ambulance model as the Army Ambulance group of set 1512, but in blue instead of army khaki. The set was made postwar from 1948 to 1959. In 1957 the ambulance was modernized and simplified; the cab gained a more streamlined appearance and had a split windscreen with a vertical strut down the centre instead of the full-width opening of the earlier model, but the cab doors no longer opened."

Along with the descriptions of many of the sets depicting British army regiments, Keeble has done something that I've never before encountered in a toy soldier book: he devotes a paragraph to the actual history of the regiment, discussing its origins, name changes and what regiments it amalgamated with during the frequent reorganizations of the British Army.

There is more information about Britains model changes, painting styles, base markings, and Britains set numbering practices in the introduction of the book which also includes a lengthy discussion of Britains boxes and labels. This is enhanced by a section with photos of over 50 box labels, among them some of the more attractive labels the firm produced, like the post-1922 label for set 33; 16/5<sup>th</sup>

Lancers, a good selection of Whisstock artwork, and the Art Nouveau inspired labels for Egyptian Infantry; set 117, dated Jan.20th, 1901, and Boar Cavalry; set 6, dated pre-1910.

This is another welcome addition to the growing number of excellent books about old toy soldiers. It's available through the Royal Ontario Museum's gift shop(416-586-5784 or 416-586-5777) and can also be purchased online through Amazon com.'s Canadian web site.







### BARCLAY'S Little Cars and TRUCKS from the 1960's...



An area of the Barclay realm that even bewilders some advanced collectors is the rather prolific group of two-inch long die cast vehicles made and sold from the early 1960's until the cessation of business operations. Today, they can often be found at flea markets, toy and antique shows and even estate sales, buried in boxes of loose Matchbox and other small vehicles.

Richard O'Brien's COLLECTING AMERICAN MADE TOY SOLDIERS, COLLECTING TOY CARS AND TRUCKS, and THE SECOND CATALOG BOOK taken together provide good coverage of these vehicles. However, there are at least 31 variations of several vehicle styles that have never been

assigned a unique "BV" number.

We have enjoyed collecting these cars and trucks for many years and with one exception, (BV97 Fire Chief car with siren) I think we have them all......but then you never know. When several collectors told me that they had difficulty identifying these vehicles, I decided to write this article for OTS. My challenge was to create a layout scheme that would be clear and informative but would also be useful as a reference guide to those who may want to put a copy in their "Hunting Bag". After much experimentation, I decided that constructing a table using vehicle style as the primary definer and listing O'Brien numbered and the unnumbered variations in adjacent columns would be the clearest way to present them. The photos are in the same sequence as the table for ease of cross referencing the 56 variations of this interesting subset of little cars and trucks. I then took the liberty of creating "BV" numbers for the unnumbered vehicles by adding an alphabetic suffix to the item number of the same style vehicle. These numbers will have to suffice until Richard's next book, which I am told is not totally out of the question.

Hopefully, the photos and table are sufficient to identify each vehicle but let me offer some observations that may not be readily apparent.

While the vast majority of the trucks have a Federal style cab with a standard long hood, the BV91 tractor/trailers; the BV93 Logging Truck and BV92c, the "A & P REFRIGERATION" truck have cabs with a more modern looking flat front, somewhat suggestive of the Ford tilt-back truck cab.

Most of wheels/tires are plain metal or black plastic. BV87, BV101 and BV102b, the Hot rod version of the small VW, are the only ones I found with the large rubber tires with a center rib. (Footnote 1). BV98b, one of the VINTAGE CARs has beige plastic tires and a 5th one which was used as the steering wheel. All the other Vintage Cars have spoked, metal wheels and a common nail for the steering wheel. Some of Barclay's final production lots of these vehicles were painted in neon colors and had plastic "WSW" tires.

The wheel axles of these vehicles are attached to the chassis either through holes in the axle support posts or by snapping them into notches in the axle support.

There have been several articles in OTS over time that pointed out technical inaccuracies in some of Barclay's castings and descriptions of military figures. Another example of this is the insignia decals on the roof of the cars and on the cabs of the trucks of the 1960 vintage "U.S. ARMY" vehicles. These decals are in fact U.S. AIR FORCE airplane wing insignias, circa 1950's and 1960's. The correct decal would have been a plain white, 5-pointed star.

The very small BV108 cars were most probably made initially for Barclay's BV107 single and double deck car carriers. There are however, 2 very distinct versions of this auto. The ones pictured on page 64 of Richard's COLLECTING TOY CARS AND TRUCKS are BV108 and have 2 side windows versus a single side window seen on BV108a. Upon closer inspection I found that the grills and front bumpers of these 2 cars are also quite different (see photo AA below). With a little stretch, one could imagine that BV108 was modeled after the Packard and that BV108a modeled after the DeSoto, of the 1950's. Well on second thought, maybe it takes more than a little stretch of imagination to see the similarities of these toys to real automobiles of that era but what toy collector is going to argue with imagination?



I believe that nearly all of these vehicles were initially sold in plastic bubble wrap packed with 1 to 6 vehicles, on hang cards, as shown in Richard's previously referenced books. Today, with the exception of the occasional "old store stock " discovery, most of them are found minus their original packaging. Insofar as today's prices for MINT specimens of these vehicles, BV91's with the rarer company decals such as "RAILWAY EXPRESS" and "WOOLWORTHS", the hospital trucks, BV104 and BV158, and the BV100 "COCA COLA" and "PEPSI COLA beverage trucks sell for around \$35. Most of the military vehicles, the race cars and the single chassis trucks with rarer company decals fetch prices approaching \$30. The remainder and those with no decals would sell in the \$20-25 range. In looking for these little guys for over 25 years, I have only seen one example of each of the following: BV96a "U.S. ARMY" sedan with the siren on the roof; BV158 larger hospital truck; BV162a "CITROEN" variant of BV162; and



BV159 the sports car with 2-people in it. I suppose these rarer items could bring as much as \$40 to \$45 from a really compulsive collector...of which I know a few....or maybe more than a few.

The 2 variations of the BV104 Hospital Truck go beyond decal and paint differences. BV158 is larger and has other clear casting differences. Two other styles of vehicle also have major variations that have not been depicted in previous literature. The BV99e OIL TRUCK varies from all other BV99's in the design of the fuel tank and the method of attaching it to the chassis as shown below.

The other style of vehicle that has more than cosmetic differences is the "midget auto" RACE CAR variant. As shown in the previous photos, BV101a has significant differences in the body styling versus BV101 yet the tires and driver are the same.

As I studied these cars and trucks while working on this article, some questions came to mind. How did Barclay select the companies whose names and logos were displayed on these trucks? Why not a "7-UP" BV100 or a "MAYFLOWER VAN LINES" BV91? Did Barclay receive any compensation much less permission from the companies they were promoting? I took the time to call the corporate offices of 2 of the companies to see if they could provide any answers to these questions. Well not surprisingly, I found no one who could help me or who even heard of Barclay and I could almost hear their eyebrows raising when I tried to explain why I was calling. Then I realized that 1960 was 43 years ago and probably no one working at these companies today was working there when Barclay employees were gluing paper decals on these little cars and trucks. My how time flies when you are having so much fun finding toy cars and trucks and soldiers.

I sure hope that there are some other variants in this group of 1960 vintage vehicles out there and I would really appreciate hearing from those of you who have them so I can add them to my "WANT" list, which I sure hope never becomes blank. And if someone has an extra BV97 Fire Chief car, (conspicuously absent from the photo gallery), I would sure appreciate hearing from you.

#### **Britains Physicians**

Sergeant: "But I am faint, my gashes cry for help!"

"So well thy words become thee as thy wounds, Duncan:

they smack of honour both—Go get him Surgeons."

Shakespeare's Macbeth, 1605

Military medicine is very old in Great Britain. The gravestone of a young physician of a Roman Legion has been found. Surgeons are mentioned in Arthurian legends. An equally ancient joke describes military medicine as the second oldest profession.

There were military surgeons in the Standing Army formed after the Restoration of King Charles II, circa 1660. In the next century, the great John Hunter served in the Army, and was later Surgeon

General. He is considered the father of scientific surgery.

In Napoleonic times two Scots, Guthrie and McGrigor, were the equal of the magnificent French surgeons. Their ideas were very similar. However, they had Wellington, no innovator, to contend with—not

the enlightened Napoleon.

The far-flung British Empire in which the British Army served during the 19th Century had every imaginable climate and condition. The British surgeon was usually independent, tough, and highly skilled. Most were Scots, and their contributions to the development of tropical medicine were voluminous. As one example, within a year of the discovery of the x-ray in 1895, a primitive but workable fluoroscope was hauled by bearers for use high in the mountains of the Indian Frontier.

More than a few high decorations and mentions in dispatches were won in combat, usually in murderous conditions. Surgeon Reynolds at Rorke's Drift during the Zulu War comes easily to mind. There have been only three British soldiers who have won double Victoria Crosses. The Royal Army Medical Corps, formed in 1898, is distinctive to have had Noel Godfrey Chavasse and Arthur Martin-Leake win two of these medals for extreme valor.

Britains Ltd. produced a variety of members of the Royal Army Medical Corps. These included medical officers, nurses, stretcher teams, and orderlies, as well as medical tents and both horse-drawn and motor-powered ambulances with Red Crosses. Medical units remain most popular among a multitude of manufacturers-old and new. Medics still sell well.

This article confines itself to the physicians. military and civilian, in the Britains Range, Ten to twelve are known, although several of these may be special production or special paintings not listed in the catalogs Britains issued.

The first of the medical officers and probably the most popular ones have a distinguished longevity. They flourished from 1905 to 1941. Set 137 (Photo 1), the first set to feature the R.A.M.C., is an early number. The dark blue uniform included a helmet with a ball rather than a spike, and had a further distinction. Long after almost



all the other early figures were redesigned with a "square base," the medical officers retained a round base. This base was in turn, paper labeled underneath. then embossed with lettering, including its date of origin (March 20, 1905), and then finally embossed without a date. (Photo 2)

There are two types of medical officers. The senior one wears an ornate cocked and plumed hat. The plumes were at first striped dark blue and gray, but by 1939 were maroon (dull cherry) and white. The medals on the casting's chest were painted on the earlier

versions. The other officer wears a helmet with a ball. Both of these round-based officers are fixed-arm, standing with their left hands rested on their sheathed swords. Britains Ltd.'s only other use of this casting was its transformation into an officer of the King's Royal Rifle Corps, and a field marshal in the Staff Officers of Set 1908 in 1940-41. (Photo 3)

The poses of these two standing officers are clearly derived from the plate that appeared in the March 16, 1897 edition of the Army and Navy Gazette, and were part

of the Military Types Series drawn by Richard Simkin. Alas, the chaplain and the R.A.M.C. Sergeant Major depicted by Simkin were never made by Britains Ltd. (Illustration #1) Simkin's Plate 175 of July 5, 1902, shows a magnificent Surgeon General mounted at the halt on a sway-backed horse. (Illustration #2) I have seen one example of this piece—perhaps a special painting done on request by Britains, or someone's long-ago conversion. (Illustrations #1 and #2 of the Simkin prints accompanying this article were supplied

In a "one of" collection in London, that of a former major dealer and collector, I have seen a very early ball-helmeted medical officer, marching with a sword in his moveable right hand, in Review Order. Uniquely, he has a roundel patch with a Red Cross on a white background, high on his left sleeve. This is the

only medical officer that I have seen with a Red Cross. I believe it is authentic, but if not, some pixie with a paint brush was working in the "dawn of time."

The English dealer and scholar G.M. Haley has identified a number of head size and helmet variations on the Review Order standing medical officer. In an act of monumental kindness, he documented and sketched these out for me. Perhaps the earliest Britains sets had proper dull cherry facings and trouser stripes, but they probably turned to the scarlet that was in constant daily use to paint the "red-coated" Guards, Highlanders, and Line Infantry that they produced in such prodigious quantities.

Another early "medical officer" deserves mention. Set #38, the South African **Britains Special Paint** Mounted Infantry, were led by the comic opera figure of Dr. Leander Starr Jameson (Photo 4), who is galloping along with a drawn half-pistol in this set. (I have long been convinced that the half pistol is to keep him from shooting his own horse.) His 600 "police" invaded the



Transvaal in 1896 hoping to spark a rebellion by the English-speaking population, but his raid only lasted a few days when confronted by the irate Boers. Even with their abject surrender, he was wildly popular with a jingoistic England. Suffice to remember that some of his men were so drunk that they mistook a fence line for a telegraph line to the Boer Capital of Johannesburg and cut

After these sets, there is a long gap until the next medical sets appear. In the interim, a multitude of flatcapped khaki combat figures were introduced. By 1939 there were several stretcher teams in khaki (in Sets 1719 and 1723), but no flat-cap medical officers. Possibly the

horrendous casualties and the "vanished army" of the Great War made the whole idea unappealing. No doubt some special painting will surface and prove me happily wrong.

However, in the civilian section of the catalog, the St. John's Ambulance Brigade First Aid Section appeared in 1936. Set 1426 first appeared in the usual gloss paint. Upon the request of the St. John's

Brigade, they were brought out in a second version in a most unique matte finish. Now the gloss black belt could stand out against a very dark blue uniform with flat cap and brown gloves. (Photo 4)

The St. John's Volunteers are a famous first aid and evacuation service. They can trace their lineage to the Knights Hospitaliers of Jerusalem, Rhodes, and Malta. The "Johnnies" were the best trained and most highly regarded stretcher-bearers and medics of the Boer War. They served as a ready reserve for the R.A.M.C., Royal Navy, and the R.A.F. medical units. (See OTS, Volume 15, Issue #3 for a full article on the St. John's Ambulance Brigade.)

It was not long, with war clouds gathering, before modern Battledress troops were mustered into the Britains Range. In 1940, a new steel-helmeted officer appeared and was quickly adapted to the

new field hospital sets (including Sets 1896,1897,1909, and 1910). [Photo 5] The medical officer carries a swagger stick or baton in his right hand. It is not likely that this is a medical instrument, being that it is too long for a thermometer, and too thin to be a proctoscope.

A variation of this Battledress medical officer

appeared quite briefly in 1940-41 in Sets 1909 and 1910, both large display boxes. The figure is the rarest of the rare; he carries a book in his right hand, using the moveable arm from the Country Clergyman, #593 of the Farm Series. (See the accompanying Photo 6, Set #1910, from Joe Wallis' *Armies of the World*.) Postwar, only Set 1897 offered this R.A.M.C. physician (although he was available in a combatant role as the officer for such sets as #1858 and #1893).

I suppose I should make a mention of Doc from Snow White and her vertically challenged friends. He is in my collection; partly for completeness and partly because he resembles a close friend.

Finally, in 1983 Britains made a pair of the finest medical figures that they ever produced, in my opinion. They are in the very sharp, Super Deetail plastic hospital sets (#7851 and #7857). These short-lived sets are markedly superior to other manufacturers' hospital personnel and patients. The male

physician has character! His pose and balding head exude confidence and maturity. He carries a chart in his left hand and a curled stethoscope in the pocket of a long white coat. Behold! The second figure is an attractive woman doctor. She wears a green dress

and the usual long white coat. She has a folder in her right hand. She is only identified as hospital staff—in one set as a radiologist and in another as a pediatrician. (Photo 7)

I'll conclude with a comment from the Britains Catalog that describes the Hospital Series. Try it! The German for Hospital Maternity Unit is *Krankenhaus-Entbindungsstastion! Gesundheit!*
