
# A Look at the Labels and Trademarks of the Old German Makers

# Part 1: "The Biggest Box of Heydes I've Ever Seen"

Many years ago I received a phone call from a fellow collector telling me that a local flea market dealer was selling what he enthusiastically described as "the biggest box of Heydes I've ever seen!" Why me? Apparently I had somehow managed to earn a bit of a reputation as the guy who was interested in the old stuff. It must have been well deserved because a few days later, I arranged to meet with the dealer with the intention of adding the set to my slowly growing collection of "Heyde" figures.

The set was both a pleasant surprise and a bit of a puzzle. The soldiers themselves were obviously very old German-made figures, yet, although they all appeared to have been produced by the same maker, they represented two completely unrelated

sets. The first was a magnificent 20 piece Prussian Field Artillery unit complete with the traditional cannonball helmets while the second was an equally impressive 18 piece British Infantry unit marching on oval bases. Adding to the confusion was the fact that the standard bearer, perfectly represented in red coat and bearskin hat, was carrying an American flag! Both sets were packed together in a huge dovetailed box with a totally unfamiliar label.

The label itself was dominated by a large figure of a standing Renaissance-era knight holding a banner which unfurled across the length of the label. The section directly above the knight's head contained the outline of a sword and the letters J.G.H. with the word Schutzmarke printed directly underneath. Opposite the knight was a representation of a medal depicting the face of Ludwig II, apparently awarded for excellence at an 1875 exposition held in the city of Nuremberg. Completing the label were the words "Made in Germany" along with "Extra Fine Plastic Tin Composition Figures" presented in English as well as French and German. The center area where one would expect to see a description of the contents was completely blank.

Given my passion for the old and unusual, there was no way I could possibly resist making the purchase. Yet I couldn't help wondering how they all ended up together. Was it possible that they all might actually belong with the box? Why would a British standard bearer have an American Flag and most importantly, who was J.G.H.?

My first clue arrived courtesy of Joe Shimek who carried along photos of the box on a trip to Germany. According to the "old timers" my box was made by a firm named Heinrich. Although I wasn't familiar with the firm, I soon found a brief reference to it in John Garratt's The World Encyclopedia of Model Soldiers. "Within the last decade it has been established by Richards that many of the soldiers

previously attributed to Heyde were made by Gebr. Heinrich. Their trademark was a knight with a banner and shield on an armoured horse, with GH above the horse's head," and registered in England in 1895. Although I now had documentation for the firm of Heinrich, I also had two very different trademarks. While both featured images of knights with banners, there was nothing to indicate that they represented the same maker.

A second breakthrough took place a few years later at the OTSN Chicago show when I purchased a beautiful boxed set of 70mm British Infantry produced by the firm of Gebruder Heinrich, complete with the previously described trademark and an illustration of an 1875 award medal. In addition, I now had the opportunity to compare the known Gebruder Heinrich figures to those from the J.G.H. box. There were enough similarities to indicate strongly that all of the figures were produced by the same maker. I was certain that the J.G.H Schutzmarke was simply an earlier version of the Gebruder Heinrich trademark, a fact that could be easily proved by simply comparing the 1875 award medals illustrated on the two boxes.

I was sure that the two awards would be identical. After all, what was the likelihood that there could possibly have been two firms named Heinrich producing lead toy soldiers in Germany during the 1870's? Even if there were, the odds that both firms would be awarded medals in 1875 would have to be astronomical. But against all odds, I was clearly looking at two different award medals. J.G.H. was definitely not Gebruder Heinrich.


Although I was sure I had a Heinrich box and was confident that the figures were also of Heinrich production, I still could not identify J.G.H. My only remaining recourse was to simply fumble my way through every available German toy soldier book I could get my hands on in hopes of finding a name which matched the initials J.G.H. Surprisingly, it worked! I found two individuals who not only shared the correct initials but also shared the same name, Johann Georg Heinrich.

Who was Johann Georg Heinrich? From what I've been able to learn, the elder J.G.H. was a baker by trade but started producing toy soldiers in 1860 in partnership with Johann Casper Engert. Upon

his death in 1862, the firm continued production under the direction of his widow, with Engert leaving the firm in 1863. In 1864, the oldest Heinrich son, Johann Konrad, received his license to produce zinnfiguren and assumed management of the firm. He was joined by his younger brother Johann Georg in 1867 from which point the firm was referred to as Gebruder (brothers) Heinrich.

Which J.G.H. produced my box? The fact that the elder Johann Georg died some 13 years prior to the firm receiving the award illustrated on my box would certainly eliminate him as the maker. Therefore, my box must have been produced by his youngest son, the other Johann Georg Heinrich. Although there is no known evidence indicating that the two Heinrich brothers ever dissolved their partnership, there is strong evidence that J.G.H. continued to produce toy soldiers for several more decades. I

recently received some photocopied pages from an old book of toy maker trademarks written by Gwen White. On the top of page 59, I found a drawing of a J.G.H. schutzmarke identical to the one pictured on my box. The accompanying text identifies it as the trademark for the firm of Johann Georg Heinrich which was registered in England in 1896.

Unfortunately, this evidence does not extend to the figures. While both sets share characteristics with known Heinrich figures and are likely of the correct vintage, there is simply no way to prove that they actually belong with the box. Yet, with a little speculation based on established facts, I believe a strong case can be made to support the possibility that they may actually be a set.

We know that German makers were producing solid cast figures by the 1840's and were actively exporting them by the 1860's. Unfortunately, the Civil War would certainly have interrupted any plans for export to the United Stares. It's also reasonable to assume that for a period of time immediately following the conflict, American consumers would likely have avoided buying toys associated with war. The German toy soldier makers would certainly have been aware of the huge potential of the American market. It's likely that they would have waited patiently, occasionally testing the market for a shift in consumer attitude with small trial exports. Since they were only measuring potential demand, it's unlikely that they would have invested the time and resources to first develop new lines of American military units. They more likely would have used figures already on hand and "Americanized" them, perhaps by simply replacing the Union Jack with the Stars and Stripes.

I personally believe that the J.G.H. box and figures may well represent this type of export to America. It certainly would explain both the presence of the American flag and the blank contents area on the box label. More importantly, however, I believe that it also explains the use of the J.G.H. box. If the firm of Gebruder Heinrich were involved in a trial export to America and using older figures which

didn't necessarily represent their best work, they certainly would have been reluctant to package them in a box displaying their company trademark, a problem easily resolved by the fact that the old J.G.H. trademark was available to them.

Shortly after completing the above text, I found a new style of Heinrich label with an illustration of the 1875 medal which clearly matches the one pictured on the J.G.H. box. For some unknown reason, the illustrations on the Heinrich box used in my original comparison did not picture the entire award. The fact that the same award appears on both boxes supports my original conclusion that the J.G.H. trademark was also used by the firm of Gebruder Heinrich. Since the two brothers assumed management of their father's firm, it stands to reason that they would have continued to use his trademark in their early days of production. The fact that the J.G.H. trademark was registered in England one year after the brothers registered their own trademark would seem to indicate that they continued to use it, most likely for figures of lesser quality.

I hope you enjoyed my little toy soldier mystery. While trying to identify J.G.H, I came to realize how important a box label or trademark can be. I also realized that my collecting interests had expanded to include photos of old German-made box labels. I hope to share some of what I've learned about these labels and trademarks with you In future articles, but I need to emphasize that my expertise is limited to that of an interested collector. This is an ongoing project and I would like to invite you to get involved. I'm reasonably sure that I'm not the only collector in the history of our hobby to have chanced upon an unidentified boxed set of German solids. If you have an old unidentified German-made set in your collection, please take a photo and pass it on. I'll be happy to identify it for you if I can and if not, with your permission, will add it to my photo collection and hopefully feature it in a future article or update.

# FORWARD MARCH! - AGINCOURT SERIES II



In 2002, Forward March! released Agincourt Series I, 5 sets depicting the French and English combatants of this epic battle. Due to the high quality of sculpting and painting, Agincourt Series I prove immensely popular, selling out quickly

Collectors anxiously awaited the availability of Agincourt Series II, eager for mounted French knights and additional English longbow men. Forward March! collectors have been rewarded with the announced release of Agincourt Series II. Continuing the high quality of Agincourt Series I, the new

releases are 4 in number; English Archer Set #2, Count of Vendome on horse, a hand to hand combat set depicting Edmund de Thorpe and Duke of Orleans, and finally Count of Marle on horse. A four piece stake set is also available.



Received for review are the English Archer set, and mounted piece, Count of Marle. Both sets are up to the usual high standards of painting and sculpting one has come to expect from the connoisseur quality of Forward March! Alan Ball has done an exceptional job of portraying all figures in very natural fluid poses. Beautifully proportioned, clothing appears very realistic with folds and draping adding greatly to enhance these truly wonderful figures.

As usual, Forward March! has continued with their high degree of shading and highlighting, giving a very realistic look, yet retaining their toy soldier charm. Not one flaw was noted in the meticulous painting, and every figure was finished to the highest standard.

The English Archers measured 60mm from their terrain base to the top of their helmet, while the Count of Marle on horseback measured an impressive 95mm from base to helmet. The Count of Marle



figure is truly a work of art, mounted on his warhorse with sword in hand. A very nice feature which adds to the supremacy of this figure is that the rider is pegged, and is inserted into the hole in the horse blanket. This insures that the rider sits properly and realistically - a style I wish more manufacturers would use.

Forward March! has informed me that both Agincourt Series I and II will be available in May 2004. This is great news for those who may have missed out on Series I. A new Civil War series is to be added in 2004, along with further additions to the Agincourt and First Manassas Series.

High quality, good customer service and competitively priced, (2 piece set-\$46, mounted knight-\$62), Forward March! represents a great value for the collector.



# **Durso Composition Figures** "The Medical Scene"

by Vincent J. Russo and Patrice Servais

#### Introduction

In previous articles in this magazine, we have reported how Michel Klimov, founder and owner of The Durso Company (Liege Belgium 1938-1988) went to great lengths in the design of his figures to create, as accurately as possible, the "real life" subjects he was portraying. Attention to even the most minute detail, was the "standard" of this extraordinary man, and his company.

It was a natural evolution from the figures of "soldiers in combat", for the Durso Company to create the images of wounded, and sometimes dead, "casualties of war", and those who tended to their fallen Comrades in Arms, (Doctors, Nurses, Fellow Soldiers, etc.).

All countries represented by Durso production had "medical" figures, in one form or another, depicted in the Series.

This article, along with a brief historical review of the evolution of the Company, will feature "The Medical Scene" of the many countries involved in the European/African Theaters of World War II, (and beyond).

# **Background**

Michel Klimov actually started to produce composition figures, out of his home, in 1935.

These figures, produced from 1935-1938 were labeled "BELGIUM" or "BELGIQUE" or "FABRICATION BELGE". (All imprints were on the underside of the base).

This period of "home production" served a vital purpose for Mr. Klimov. It afforded him the opportunity to prove his ability to "create" figures, and also the mechanism to develop his potential market.

Having realized success in both of these areas, and after securing the necessary financing, Mr. Klimov opened his factory in 1938 at 87 Rue Saint-Gilles, in Liege. The original name of his company was "ALMA" (Ateliers Liegeois de Moulage Artistique).

The figures initially produced in the new factory were a much improved line of "Fabrication Belge".

These figures were made using completely new molds, and were intended to compete in the lower priced "Dimestore" (Chainstore) Trade.

In 1939 the "Fabrication Belge" designation was replaced by "ALMA".

Note the "attention to detail" even in these very early figures intended for the "Dimestore" market.

In 1938, Klimov introduced the "DURSO" line of composition figures. These figures, which drew their name from the Latin phrase, <u>Duratum</u> ac <u>Solidum</u> (durable and solid), were higher quality, higher priced, and were targeted for the "Toy Specialists" trade. Often, both "ALMA" and "DURSO" figures were sold in the same stores, but at different price levels.

# **Durso Composition Figures (Cont.)**

During the period of 1940-1945, the "ALMA" line was gradually dropped and only high quality "DURSO" figures were produced. (After 1945 there was no reference to "ALMA" in the catalogs).

During the German occupation of Belgium, the factory was allowed to continue operation, even though most men were forced to work in support of the German Army, and women, who found it difficult to travel to and from the factory, most often painted figures at home.

Although sometimes "harassed" by the Germans, Klimov was able to continue production, as he wished, because he always had a "good answer" for their questions.

As the tide of the battle shifted against the Germans, Durso figures often were used to make political statements. For instance, Russian figures (which were originally allowed to be produced because Mr. Klimov indicated that they were representative of the war in Finlandia in 1939), soon became "symbols of freedom" for the Belgians. DURSO flagbearers carrying the Russian flag were openly displayed by Belgian students after the German defeat at Stalingrad.

During this time, Belgian children were often seen playing with German figures whose heads had been broken off.

As we reported earlier, most countries represented by Durso in its production of "combat" figures, usually had "medical" figures to round out the military series.

During World War II, a brave contingent of Belgian soldiers were trained in England, and returned home to participate in the liberation of Brussels. These troops wore "English" style helmets, and were known as "Pirons Brigade". After the end of the hostilities in Europe, Mr. Klimov continued to closely follow the evolution of military uniforms, particularly those of the Belgian army, and of course, incorporated any changes into his production.

As a "United Nations" participant during the Korean Conflict, the Belgians wore distinctive "American" style helmets into combat. Durso portrayed these soldiers in all phases of military activity, and of course, in "The Medical Scene".

#### **FOOTNOTE**

Soon after World War II ended, Mr. Klimov officially changed the name of the company from "ALMA" to "DURSO". By doing this, he was making it clear that he would be focusing only on the "high quality" segment of the business.

## **CONCLUSION**

The Authors sincerely hope that we have successfully shown, with our photos, that the "Toy Soldier" annuals of recent military history, would be incomplete without the portrayal of the brave men and women who comprised "The Medical Scene". Once again, The Durso Company was an integral part of that endeavor.

# **BOOK REVIEW**

### La Folie des Petits Soldats

by Dominique Pascal Reviewed by Russ Bednarek

Recently received for review is another fine French pictorial study of toy soldiers, "La Folie des Petits Soldats", by Dominique Pascal. "Petits Soldats" is one of a series of books written by Monsieur Pascal dealing with collectible items.

Though diminutive in size, (5 1/2" x 5 1/2"), "Petits Soldats" is definitely not a lightweight with its 370 pages of color photographs.

Each production style of toy soldier receives their own chapter; flats, solid and hollowcast, plastic, composition and aluminum. Examples of various makers, both past and present, are depicted, and a very brief historical text introduces the subject to the reader at the beginning of the chapter.



The book's format is simplistic, yet very appealing. Each page is a color photograph of an individual or small group of figures accompanied with a descriptive text. The photography is excellent, allowing the collector to closely examine the figure's painting and sculpting style.

The majority of the figures presented are obviously of French manufacture. CBG Mignot, Quiralu, and Starlux have a large presence, but interesting figures from smaller firms such as G.M., X.R., Mignalu and Lucotte are shown. Other companies represented are Courtney, Renaud, Lineol, MIM, and Britain's plastic.



Collectors will recognize a number of figures shown in this work. "Petits Soldats" however is not without its surprises. I was startled to see a French Spahi produced by Lineol, a figure I was unaware, (and would love to have one for my collection), that this German firm ever made.

Although not as comprehensive as Edouard Pemzec's superlative "Figurines et Soldats de Plomb", (see review in OTS Vol.27, No.4), "Petits Soldats" is deserving of a place in any collector's library.

### A 21-GUN SALUTE to BARCLAY

by Stan Alekna

Yes, there are at least 21 different Barclay cannons when you consider the eleven basic models of cannons and their variations. That these toys were purported to be the biggest sellers in the Barclay line seems to be born out by the frequency with which most of these items can be found even today. Richard O'Brien documented many of the cannons in his 3rd edition of <u>Collecting American-Made Toy Soldiers</u> but several variations have escaped detection until now. This article and accompanying photos and table are intended to pull together information from various publications into a complete and organized article and at the same time tie down a few loose ends regarding the BC numbering scheme.

As has been the style of my last few OTS Dimestore articles, I once again found that a table of descriptions and characteristics was the shortest, clearest way to present the information on the differences between models and the variants within a model.

I have not included photos of those cannons that only differed by the presence or absence of mold markings or paint color as these features are self-evident. The swivel based mortar, which is technically not a cannon, and the searchlight, which is surely not a cannon, were included simply because there is no better place to put them. It's also how I was able to fudge the total count up to 21 and make it "A 21-GUN SALUTE to BARCLAY". Who ever heard of 17-gun salute?

A few general comments up front might be helpful. Mold markings, when present, are "BARCLAY USA" as shown below except on BC 11, which has "USA" on both sides of the carriage and "MADE IN USA" on the barrel.

Let me address the new Barclay Cannon number, BC11, that I assigned to the cannon with the elevated barrel which had been previously dubbed MC1. Some time ago, this cannon had been designated as a Manoil, probably because the elevated barrel is similar to the barrel on Manoil's No. 69 cannon. However a close comparison of MC1/BC11 to Manoil's No. 69 cannon reveals that there are no similarities between

these cannons except for the angle of the barrel. On the other hand, the barrel markings and other casting features of BC11 match BC3, a known Barclay cannon. After many emails and much discussion, Richard O'Brien agreed to my designation of this cannon as BC11. However, he chooses to reserve his final judgment on whether it is a Barclay or Manoil, pending the discovery of conclusive documentation from sales or factory catalog pages. In the meantime, he will continue to run this item as MC1 and place it in the Barclay section. Richard also agreed with the assignment of BC7 to the searchlight on a swivel base.

Other general observations are that the marked barrel of BC2, Barclay's second model cannon, is the exact same barrel as was used for BC10, the last cannon model made by Barclay.

The photos below show the difference between open and closed hitches and the tang and pin hitch of the 3 models of long-range cannon, BC4, BC5 and BC9. Many of the pins and even the tips of the tangs are easily broken off these models so be alert. Also note that the shaft and knob on the end of the open hitch variation of BC2 is a true part of the casting, not a piece of flashing, and it is seldom found intact on these models.



The last item of general information is that the "handle" to the spring action firing mechanism is a loop on all variations of BC1 and BC2 but was changed to a straight piece of wire on BC5, BC6, BC8 and BC10. Today, OSHA or some other overly protective government function would probably make them use a loop on all cannons for child safety reasons!!

A few comments on specific cannons; BC1, believed by many to be Barclay's first toy, comes in 2 distinct variations, the features of which are documented in detail in my article in OTS Volume 6 Number 4.


BC2 comes in a few variations but BC2c, in addition to being a color variant, has a very different wheel hub design from the other BC2's as can be seen below.

BC5, the scarcest and highest priced Barclay cannon, is frequently found with 1 or more men or sections of the fragile railing broken. You really need to inspect specimens of this item very carefully

before deciding to purchase one. And Barclay's description of BC5 as "Coast Guard Cannon" is militarily incorrect like so many of their descriptions. The photo below was taken from a 1942 publication and shows an "8-inch RAILROAD GUN". These huge cannons could fire a 260-pound projectile as far as 5 miles and were effectively employed in WWI. This photo or one like it had to serve as the inspiration for BC5 since it even shows the crewmen behind the railing just like Barclay's casting of the cannon.



8-inch Railroad Gun



If you have any other variations beyond these 21 such as a BC3 with an open hitch and marked barrel, or a BC10 with an unmarked barrel, please contact me and I'll put a follow-up article in OTS. Of course that would ruin the 21-gun count so maybe you should keep these added variants to yourself! Just kidding of course. Incidentally, the derivation of the number 21 as in "21 Gun Salute" is that it is the sum of the digits in 1776. How bout' that for military trivia!!



# BRITAINS LIMITED PROFILES SETS THAT LOST THEIR OFFICER

By Joe Wallis

In my last article, I described all of the Britains Ltd. sets enhanced by the addition of an officer or piper to a box that previously lacked one. (See Volume 27, Issue No. 4, pages 58-61.) As shown in my preceding article, Britains Ltd. made a conscious effort to be competitive in the postwar years by ensuring that the vast majority of sets contained officers, pipers, or trumpeters.

That said, some sets started out in the catalog with officers, but later had them removed. These revisions to the contents of certain sets all occurred prior to 1928. Perhaps a brief commentary on this development would be of interest.

Set #38 began in 1896 as "Dr. Jameson and the African Mounted Infantry." It consisted of four fixed-arm troopers galloping with rifles, led by Dr. Jameson armed with a revolver held in his right hand. The bold but foolhardy attempt to invade the Transvaal

was aimed at inciting a revolt of the English speaking "Uitlanders," who had flocked to the gold and diamond fields of the Transvaal. Some 500 men were led by Dr. Leander Starr Jameson. "Jameson's Raid," as it became known, was instigated by Cecil Rhodes, but it was an abject failure. Britains Ltd. quickly capitalized on the news to issue Set #38. Within a very few years, Britains had changed the set's title to simply the "South African Mounted Infantry." Later, in 1927, the casting was replaced by a moveable-arm figure introduced in that year for the galloping U.S. Cavalry in khaki as Set #276. (This action pose would also be chosen for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police of Set #1349.) The final version of Set #38 lasted from 1927-41, and had five troopers with rifles—the old officer with the drawn pistol was banished. Perhaps the mold had broken, but just as likely an explanation is that the 1896 casting looked out-of-date.

The various Britains boxes depicting Indian Army Infantry regiments all began with an officer holding a drawn sword down and leading Sepoys walking at the trail. Sets 64, 67, and 68 (the Seventh Rajputs, the First Madras Pioneers, and the Second Bombay Grenadiers, respectively) featured an officer from 1896 until at least 1914 (possibly all the way until the introduction of a new marching at the slope Sepoy occurred about 1924). The last version of marching at the slope instead of at the trail omitted an officer. (Interestingly, when Set #1893 reintroduced the old Sepoy casting of walking at the trail in 1940, the new Indian Army Service Corps set was commanded by a British officer with a steel helmet and baton, rather than a native officer.)

In 1898, Set #92, the Spanish Infantry, was presented to the public. The set, Walking at the Trail, was led by an officer based upon the "bemedalled officer" type used for several British Infantry sets (but given an appropriate kepi for Set #92). In 1924 the original set issued at the time of the Spanish-American War was replaced by a new figure, Marching at the Slope. The new Spanish Infantry box dispensed with an officer and, as with Set #38, had a more modern appearance than its first version.

Next, we arrive at several French Army sets that began production in 1905. The marching French Infanterie de Ligne of Set #141 and the energetically charging Zouaves of Set #142 both featured catalog

illustrations and Whisstock box labels showing a marching officer with drawn sword in addition to a marching or charging infantryman. The Zouaves brought out in 1905 definitely used an oval-based fixed-arm officer in a kepi holding a drawn upright sword. In 1909, as part of Britains ongoing effort to convert most of its molds from oval bases to square bases, a new dated casting of an officer with a blanket roll across his shoulder was issued. By 1919, this

officer was no longer in use. In 1954, a mounted officer on a cantering horse was finally inserted into Set #142 to give it an officer who could lead the running Zouaves after a lapse of almost 40 years when no officer was supplied in the set.



The Prussian Infantry of Set #154, the Austro-Hungarian Infantry of Set #177, and the Austro-Hungarian Foot Guards of Set #178, all employed an unusual casting with the feet set diagonally across the base when inaugurated (in 1908 for #154, and in 1913 for Sets #177 and #178). The Prussian officer casting with a long sword scabbard was used for both the men and the officers of the two Austrian boxes. By 1919, the officer was dropped from the Prussian Infantry; at the same time, the Austrian sets adopted the standard "1910" marching figure without equipment. Sometime in the 1920s, the Austrian sets also discontinued the inclusion of an officer (which from 1919 on was simply the same 1910 figure but given an arm with a drawn sword).

The final example of a Britains set that initially featured an officer that was subsequently deleted is Set #167, the Turkish Infantry. This set first appeared in 1912 during the Balkan Wars and right after the Italo-Turkish war. The Turkish Infantry were standing on guard with fixed bayonets and wore red fezzes. For the short span of only two years, they were commanded by an officer based upon the French officer with the blanket roll and drawn sword dated 1909 (see above), but wearing a fez. (See page 141 of James Opie's Great Book of Britains for a photograph of this early and rare version of Set #167.) Sets of Turkish Infantry made between 1914 and 1941 lacked an officer.

Only the French Zouaves amongst the boxes discussed in this article lasted past 1941 (they even persevered until 1966), the others lost their officers and eventually their place in the Britains catalog.





# Welshness, Toy Soldiers & Rorke's Drift

I have a deep affection for the Welsh. In 1974 I married Sharon, a second generation American/Welsh girl. Our wedding cake was made in Wales by her cousins who then flew over the pond with its various pieces safely stowed on their laps and assembled it in Cleveland, Ohio.

During the second half of the 1950's my mother (also part Welsh) encouraged me to build forts out of blocks and gifted me the Barclay Podfoots who manned those forts. Those days when she vacuumed around a fort signaled victory. I remember as one of my proudest moments the day I walked in from school and spied my previous night's fort surrounded by of three card tables of women playing bridge.

Christmas in 1960 was bittersweet. My two older brothers gifted me their Podfoots and my mom explained that they were no longer being made and that her December "missions" to all the area dime stores had yielded nothing but empty bins. I felt both saddened and honored that my brothers gave their collections to me. I also felt afraid. With a lump in my throat, I wrapped them in tissue paper and packed them all away for safekeeping. I was 9 years old.

In the mid 1980's Sharon reawakened my long dormant love for toy soldiers by giving me a set of the Welsh Guards for Christmas. Upon re-entering the hobby, I discovered that a fascinating cottage industry scattered throughout the world had largely taken the place of the neighborhood dime store.

I celebrated the unexpected existence of magazines and trade shows that were totally dedicated to my childhood's most passionate hobby. Connecting with Jamie Delson, Bill Lango, Ed & LaVerne Miller, Bill Hocker, Thor Johnson, Nick DiVincenzo, Jim Hillestad, Jack Carleton and Jack Updike, I became acquainted with a whole new world beyond Podfoots. And together with Will Robinson, my stalwart friend, mentor and banker (very handy!), I recommenced collecting in earnest.

Sometime during my 39th year, I handed a copy of Bill Lango's magazine to Sharon and showed her an advertisement for Trophy of Wales' Boer War Steam Road Transport (EQH5). I carefully pointed out that the Transport very much resembled the antique 3 wheeled steam rollers rusting away in the yard of our family's construction equipment business. My Welsh wife took the hint and gave me this Welsh made treasure for my 40th birthday.

In the summer of 1994, Sharon and I finally made our dream pilgrimage to Wales with our three children in tow. We took great delight in meeting and becoming acquainted with several score of our Welsh relatives and communing with the land of our family's origin. Now Wales, of course, is a small country

and Cardiff was only an hour or so away from our assemblage. So we journeyed to the home of Trophy of Wales, met with Len and Stuart Taylor and toured their factory. What a memorable and spirited time we had!

It's virtually impossible to be engaged in our hobby without some exposure to 1879's Defense at Rorke's Drift. In the 1840's Jim Rorke, an Irish hunter and trader, built a house and store overlooking a drift in the Mzinyathi River. The term "drift" describes a shallow and narrow part of a river where sand and gravel have accumulated. Often they become convenient crossing points attracting travelers and activity. As such, Rorke's Drift eventually became a strategic layover on one of

the important border passages from the British colony of Natal into Zululand.

At commencement of the Anglo-Zulu War on January 11,1879 Rorke's buildings (a Swedish mission station at the time) were being used as a supply depot and hospital for Lord Chelmsford's British Columns. By January 20th Chelmsford had crossed the river, advanced several miles into Zululand and established a base camp at a place called Isandlwana. At noon on January 22nd roughly 20,000 Zulus


attacked the camp. Fewer than 60 British troops survived the massacre.

News of the slaughter at Isandlwana reached Rorke's Drift at about 3:15pm the very same day. Moreover, it was reported that 4,000 Zulus were at that very moment in route to attack the supply depot. Approximately 100 British troops were manning the garrison, mostly the 24th Foot South Wales Borderers. Coincidently, a handful of Royal Engineers commanded by Lt. John Chard had recently arrived for the purpose of repairing pontoon bridges.

By pure chance, Lt. Chard proved to be the ranking officer on site and his engineering expertise played a crucial role. Under Chard's direction, all mealie bags and biscuit boxes were emptied from the store and used to reinforce the perimeter and establish strategic barricades. The first Zulu attack came at 4:30pm, only an hour and 15 minutes later.

For the next twelve hours the 24th Foot South Wales Borderers, 100 strong, withstood and warded off intensive repeated attacks. It was an epic contest against overwhelming odds. Both sides fought with steadfast courage and valour.

At 4:30am on January 23rd the Zulus chanted a song of salute to the 24th Foot and retreated. After 12 hours of fierce battle there were only 25 casualties suffered by the defenders, 17 of which resulted in

death. Given the debacle at Isandlwana, the British took solace in the heroics of Rorke's Drift. A total of 11 Victoria Crosses were awarded, the greatest number ever given for any single battle in British history.

During our visit to Wales, therefore, it should be easy to understand why I was overcome with a rush of "Welshness" ... our family bloodlines, our wedding cake, the Taylor's, Trophy of Wales ... and the heroic South Wales Borderers. A vision of a significant Rorke's Drift diorama planted itself in my mind. My first 24th Foot and Zulu figures were purchased several days later from Len himself at the June, 1994 British Toy Soldier and Figure Show in London.

In keeping with my customary approach, I envisioned and ultimately

produced a diorama that utilizes wood to feature the figures. In this case I have used wooden topographical elements to suggest hills. While continuing to marvel at the many landscaping miracles I see throughout the hobby, I remain firmly entrenched in my personal and historical comfort zone of "blocks" and simple, rather abstract use of wood for my own productions.

During the last ten years, I have collected nearly three hundred figures and accessories for this Rorke's Drift endeavor. All figures are Trophy. The buildings, stone and mealie bag walls and redoubt came as part of Trophy's limited edition Rorke's Drift sets. Participating suppliers include Jim Hillestad, Trophy of Texas, The Old Toy Soldier Home, Spirit of '76 and MKL Models.

Paul Koepf, owner of Linsy Furniture (Cleveland, OH) designed and custom made all of my office furniture for the purpose of displaying my collection ... including the cabinet used for the Rorke's Drift diorama.

The impressive framed presentation of "Victoria Crosses of Rorke's Drift" came by way of Tarquin Shaw-Young of www.vcforvalour.com. (The Crosses are reproductions)

The splendid Enfield Martini-Henry Rifle came by way of a contact at Michigan Toy Soldier.

The Regimental Side Drum of the 24th Foot South Wales Borderers, the reproduction Zulu War Officer's Helmet, and miscellaneous stone walls came by way of Jim Hillestad.

The summary presentation of Rorke's drift battle facts was adapted from Osprey Military - Campaign Series #41.

### COLONIAL ARMIES ZULUS





# The Phillip Segal Nursery Rhyme and Fairy Tale Series Part Two

OTS Featured the Phillip Segal Nursery Rhyme and Fairy Tale Series of figures in Volume 27 # 4 Winter 2004.

An export catalog including the series was produced by Phillip Segal Toys, this catalog has since come to light along with further information on the Company since the article was published.

The catalog consisted of a series of artist impression line drawings of all of the Characters, together with an illustrated cover containing cartoon type images.





Each line drawing has the Rhyme associated with each set printed below the image. Correspondence with John Segal, son of Phillip Segal indicated that Walt Disney had been approached regarding the licensing of certain Segal sets, this licensing agreement never materialized it is therefore something of a mystery that the Three Pigs with it were issued as part of the series.

Along with the catalog, a number of letters have been made available to OTS, including two sent from Phillip Segal to a Chicago Illinois Company named Special Supply Source in response to a request for Segal figures to be exported to the US.

A letter dated January 1949 mentions the inclusion of the Nursery Rhyme and Fairy Tale Series in the Phillip Segal Toys current catalog, while a follow up letter dated February 1950 indicates that the Nursery Rhyme and Fairy Tale series has been discontinued as it had "proved not to be so popular".

The series was therefore in production for just under one year, accounting for the rarity of the items today.







Well, it's official. My publisher has decided that, given the current market and the high production cost of my toy-soldier books, they won't be doing any new editions. So from now on I'll confine my toy-soldier writing to articles like this.


The Shackman catalogs are still offering some information. The 1946-47 issue, probably put out about September, 1946, shows Betons being offered (with a mix-up on the listings). Also listed, with the same code given Grey Irons before the war, are almost certainly that company's figures (and without their foreign pieces, which were offered by Shackman just before the war began). Even more interesting is the single listing for 37/383, "Soldier mounted on horse. Made of pulp". This is undoubtedly the Molded Products piece, perhaps a left-over, or a last gasp by Molded Products before it gave up soldier production.

In an undated catalog, probably from 1945, Shackman uses the same prefix, 37, starting from 375. Again, the soldiers are "made of pulp", and presumably from Molded Products, but Shackman, as always, cutting costs, uses two illustrations of Barclay's infantrymen. It's not surprising that Shackman carried Molded Products, as it had the same salesman, Irving

Reader, that Barclay had employed, pre-war (and later post-war).






Mold records I have indicate production of Barclay's reindeer began in early 1949, with some turned out that year as Rudolph of the famous red nose. Barclay's George Fall believed the piece was only sold for a year, but Sears catalogs in 1965 and 1967 show it (though not as Rudolph) as part of a winter set.

Ron Steiner recently acquired the illustrated Plastic Toys box of cowboys and Indians. So far there's no indication that the firm made more than the one type of Indian. There seems to have been five cowboys (and a cowgirl), but I'm not sure I've seen two of them; one kneeling with pistols and the other with a pistol raised. Has anyone?

It occurred to me recently that many Barclay collectors haven't seen catalog pages of that company's offerings in the 1930s, so here are three Illustrations, one full-page, from the September, 1935 Butler Brother catalog. Nice stuff, and pretty good prices, too.





## WALKER'S BULLDOG The U. S. M41 Light Tank

By E. W. Fitzgerald

#### The "Bulldog"

Lt. General Walton H. Walker, West Point 1912, was a protege of General Patton during World War II and commanded the U. S. XX Corps in Northwest Europe. On June 25, 1950, when North Korea invaded the South, General Walker was CG of the depleted 8th U. S. Army on occupation duty in Japan. The much decorated General led U. S. Forces to repulse the North Korean invaders and, after breaking out of the defensive perimeter at Pusan, drove north taking Pyongyang, the North Korean capital on October 20,1950. When massed Chinese forces attacked on November 25, 1950, General Walker withdrew his forces back to south of the 38th Parallel. As the General was moving about to encourage his field units, he was killed in a jeep accident near Seoul on December 22, 1950 - the same fate that befell his mentor, General Patton, exactly five years to the day before.





#### The Tank

After World War II, the U. S. Army began work on a new light tank to replace the M24 Chaffee. The M41 entered service in 1951 and was named the "Walker Bulldog" in honor of the recently departed 8th Army CG. The M41 proved itself a very reliable tank. The M41 A3 was used extensively by ARVN armor units during the Vietnam War. The 26-ton M41 A3 could do 45 mph, powered by a Continental air-cooled supercharged 500 HP engine, and had a crew of 4. Armament featured a 76mm main gun augmented by .50 and .30 caliber machine guns. The Walker Bulldog was the first U. S. tank to have a bore fume extractor (located at the end of the main gun tube just short of the blast deflector). 5,500 M41 tanks were built by General Motors in the early 1950s.

#### The Model

In 2001, 21st Century Toys produced a highly accurate 1/18 scale model of the M41 Walker Bulldog with working tracks, rotating turret, elevating main gun (complete with bore fume extractor), topped off with a .50 caliber machine gun. This model tank bears Fifth U. S. Army tactical markings which may not be accurate as following World War II, 5th U. S. Army became an administrative command headquartered in Chicago! This model was made in China. (Could it be anywhere else?)
